## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
2	relating to the mental health program for veterans.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 434.351, Government Code, is amended by
5	adding Subdivision (2-a) to read as follows:
6	(2-a) "Peer service coordinator" means a person who
7	recruits and retains veterans, peers, and volunteers to participate
8	in the mental health program for veterans and related activities.
9	SECTION 2. Section 434.352(b), Government Code, is amended
10	to read as follows:
11	(b) For the mental health program for veterans, the
12	commission shall:
13	(1) provide training to <u>peer service</u> [ <del>volunteer</del> ]
14	coordinators and peers in accordance with Section 434.353;
15	(2) provide technical assistance to peer service
16	[ <del>volunteer</del> ] coordinators and peers;

- 17 (3) <u>identify</u> [recruit], train, and communicate with
- 18 community-based <u>licensed mental health professionals</u> [therapists],
- 19 community-based organizations, and faith-based organizations; and
- 20 (4) coordinate services for justice involved
- 21 veterans.
- SECTION 3. Section 434.353(a), Government Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- 24 (a) The commission shall develop and implement methods for

- 1 providing peer service [volunteer] coordinator certification
- 2 training to peer service [volunteer] coordinators, including
- 3 providing training for initial certification and recertification
- 4 and providing continuing education.
- 5 SECTION 4. Section 1001.221, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Subdivision (1-a) to read as follows:
- 7 (1-a) "Peer service coordinator" means a person who
- 8 recruits and retains veterans, peers, and volunteers to participate
- 9 in the mental health program for veterans and related activities.
- 10 SECTION 5. Section 1001.222(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) The department shall develop a mental health
- 13 intervention program for veterans. The program must include:
- 14 (1) peer-to-peer counseling;
- 15 (2) access to licensed mental health professionals for
- 16 peer service [volunteer] coordinators and peers;
- 17 (3) training approved by the department for peer
- 18 service coordinators, licensed mental health professionals, and
- 19 peers;
- 20 (4) technical assistance for peer service [volunteer]
- 21 coordinators, licensed mental health professionals, and peers;
- 22 (5) identification [grants to regional and local
- 23 organizations providing services under this subchapter;
- 24 [<del>(6) recruitment</del>], retention, and screening of
- 25 community-based licensed mental health professionals [therapists];
- (6)  $\left[\frac{(7)}{}\right]$  suicide prevention training for peer
- 27 service [volunteer] coordinators and peers; and

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- 1  $\underline{(7)}$  [ $\frac{(8)}{}$ ] veteran jail diversion services, including
- 2 veterans <u>treatment</u> courts.
- 3 SECTION 6. Section 1001.224, Health and Safety Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 1001.224. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than December 1 of
- 6 each year, the department shall submit a report to the governor and
- 7 the legislature that includes:
- 8 (1) the number of veterans who received services
- 9 through the mental health program for veterans;
- 10 (2) the number of peers and peer service [volunteer]
- 11 coordinators trained;
- 12 (3) [a summary of the grants awarded and services
- 13 provided through those grants;
- 14  $\left[\frac{(4)}{4}\right]$  an evaluation of the services provided under
- 15 this subchapter; and
- (4)  $[\frac{(5)}{}]$  recommendations for program improvements.
- 17 SECTION 7. The following laws are repealed:
- 18 (1) Section 434.351(4), Government Code;
- 19 (2) Section 1001.221(3), Health and Safety Code; and
- 20 (3) Section 1001.223, Health and Safety Code.
- 21 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
