2	relating to inclusion of instruction regarding interaction with
3	peace officers in the required curriculum for certain public school
4	students and in driver education courses and to civilian
5	interaction training for peace officers.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
8	amended by adding Section 28.012 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 28.012. INSTRUCTION ON INTERACTION WITH LAW
10	ENFORCEMENT. (a) In this section:
11	(1) "Board" means the State Board of Education.
12	(2) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on Law
13	Enforcement.
14	(3) "Driver training school" has the meaning assigned
15	by Section 1001.001.
16	(b) The board and the commission shall enter into a
17	memorandum of understanding that establishes each agency's
18	respective responsibilities in developing instruction, including
19	curriculum and instructional modules, on proper interaction with
20	peace officers during traffic stops and other in-person encounters.
21	The instruction must include information regarding:
22	(1) the role of law enforcement and the duties and
23	responsibilities of police officers;
24	(2) a person's rights concerning interactions with

1 police officers; 2 (3) proper behavior for civilians and police officers during interactions; 3 4 (4) laws regarding questioning and detention by police officers, including any law requiring a person to present proof of 5 identity to a police officer, and the consequences for a person's or 6 7 officer's failure to comply with those laws; and 8 (5) how and where to file a complaint against or a 9 compliment on behalf of a police officer. 10 (c) In developing the instruction under this section, the 11 board and the commission may consult with any interested party, 12 including a volunteer work group convened for the purpose of making 13 recommendations regarding the instruction. (d) Before finalizing any instruction under this section, 14 15 the board and the commission shall provide a reasonable period for public comment. 16 17 (e) Subject to rules adopted by the board, a school district or open-enrollment charter school may tailor the instruction 18 developed under this section as appropriate for the district's or 19 school's community. In tailoring the instruction, the district or 20 school shall solicit input from local law enforcement agencies, 21 driver training schools, and the community. 22 SECTION 2. Section 28.025, Education Code, is amended by 23 adding Subsection (b-20) to read as follows: 24 25 (b-20) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to include the instruction developed under Section 28.012 in one or 26 27 more courses in the required curriculum for students in grade

1 levels 9 through 12. SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 1001, Education Code, is 2 amended by adding Section 1001.109 to read as follows: 3 4 Sec. 1001.109. INFORMATION RELATING TO TRAFFIC STOPS. The commission by rule shall require that information relating 5 (a) to law enforcement procedures for traffic stops be included in the 6 7 curriculum of each driver education course and driving safety course. The curriculum must include: 8 9 (1) a demonstration of the proper actions to be taken during a traffic stop; and 10 11 (2) information regarding: (A) the role of law enforcement and the duties 12 13 and responsibilities of police officers; (B) a person's rights concerning interactions 14 15 with police officers; 16 (C) proper behavior for civilians and police officers during interactions; 17 18 (D) laws regarding questioning and detention by police officers, including any law requiring a person to present 19 20 proof of identity to a police officer, and the consequences for a person's or officer's failure to comply with those laws; and 21 22 (E) how and where to file a complaint against or a 23 compliment on behalf of a police officer. 24 (b) In developing the curriculum under this section, the 25 commission may consult with any interested party, including a volunteer work group convened for the purpose of making 26 27 recommendations regarding the curriculum.

1 SECTION 4. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended 2 by adding Subsection (n) to read as follows: (n) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the 3 commission shall require an officer to complete the civilian 4 interaction training program developed under Section 1701.268. An 5 officer shall complete the program not later than the second 6 7 anniversary of the date the officer is licensed under this chapter unless the officer completes the program as part of the officer's 8 basic training course. 9 10 SECTION 5. Subchapter F, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is 11 amended by adding Section 1701.268 to read as follows: Sec. 1701.268. CIVILIAN INTERACTION TRAINING PROGRAM. 12 In this section, "board" means the State Board of Education. 13 (a) (b) The commission and the board shall enter into a 14 memorandum of understanding that establishes each agency's 15 16 respective responsibilities in developing a training program, including training and testing materials, on proper interaction 17 18 with civilians during traffic stops and other in-person encounters. The training program must include information regarding: 19 20 (1) the role of law enforcement and the duties and responsibilities of police officers; 21 22 (2) a person's rights concerning interactions with 23 police officers; 24 (3) proper behavior for civilians and police officers 25 during interactions; 26 (4) laws regarding questioning and detention by police 27 officers, including any law requiring a person to present proof of

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1	identity to a police officer, and the consequences for a person's or
2	officer's failure to comply with those laws; and
3	(5) how and where to file a complaint against or a
4	compliment on behalf of a police officer.
5	(c) In developing the training program under this section,
6	the commission and the board may consult with any interested party,
7	including a volunteer work group convened for the purpose of making
8	recommendations regarding the training program.
9	(d) Before finalizing a training program under this
10	section, the commission and the board shall provide a reasonable
11	period for public comment.
12	SECTION 6. (a) Not later than September 1, 2018:
13	(1) the State Board of Education and the Texas
14	Commission on Law Enforcement shall develop:
15	(A) the instruction required under Section
16	28.012, Education Code, as added by this Act; and
17	(B) the training program required under Section
18	1701.268, Occupations Code, as added by this Act; and
19	(2) the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation
20	shall adopt rules regarding the curriculum required under Section
21	1001.109, Education Code, as added by this Act.
22	(b) Section 28.025(b-20), Education Code, as added by this
23	Act, applies beginning with the 2018-2019 school year.
24	(c) A peace officer or reserve law enforcement officer who
25	holds a license under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, issued on or
26	before January 1, 2018, shall complete a training program
27	established under Section 1701.268, Occupations Code, as added by

1 this Act, not later than January 1, 2020.

2 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
