## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT	

- 2 relating to eligibility for a TEXAS Grant and to administration of
- 3 the TEXAS grant program.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 56.304, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 7 (d) A person may not receive a TEXAS grant for more than the
- 8 lesser of:
- 9 (1) 135[<del>150</del>] semester credit hours or the equivalent;
- 10 or
- 11 (2) 15 semester credit hours or the equivalent in
- 12 excess of the degree requirements of the degree the person is
- 13 seeking.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 56.3041, Education Code, is amended by
- 15 amending Subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 16 (a) To be eligible initially for a TEXAS grant, a person
- 17 graduating from high school on or after May 1, 2013, and enrolling
- 18 in an eligible institution must:
- 19 (1) be a resident of this state as determined by
- 20 coordinating board rules;
- 21 (2) meet the academic requirements prescribed by
- 22 Paragraph (A), (B), (C), or (D) as follows:
- (A) be a graduate of a public or accredited
- 24 private high school in this state who completed the foundation high

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1 school program established under Section 28.025 or its equivalent
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- 2 and have accomplished any two or more of the following:
- 3 (i) successful completion of the course
- 4 requirements of the international baccalaureate diploma program or
- 5 earning of the equivalent of at least 12 semester credit hours of
- 6 college credit in high school through courses described in Sections
- 7 28.009(a)(1),(2), and(3);
- 8 (ii) satisfaction of the Texas Success
- 9 Initiative (TSI) college readiness benchmarks prescribed by the
- 10 coordinating board under Section 51.3062(f) on any assessment
- 11 instrument designated by the coordinating board under Section
- 12 51.3062(c) or qualification for an exemption as described by
- 13 Section 51.3062(p), (q), or (q-1);
- 14 (iii) graduation in the top one-third of
- 15 the person's high school graduating class or graduation from high
- 16 school with a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a four-point
- 17 scale or the equivalent; or
- 18 (iv) completion for high school credit of
- 19 at least one advanced mathematics course following the successful
- 20 completion of an Algebra II course or at least one advanced career
- 21 and technical or technology applications course;
- 22 (B) have received an associate degree from a
- 23 public or private institution of higher education;
- 24 (C) be an undergraduate student who has:
- (i) previously attended another
- 26 institution of higher education;
- 27 (ii) received an initial Texas Educational

- 1 Opportunity Grant under Subchapter P for the 2014 fall semester or a
- 2 subsequent academic term;
- 3 (iii) completed at least 30[24] semester
- 4 credit hours at any institution or institutions of higher
- 5 education; and
- 6 (iv) earned an overall grade point average
- 7 of at least 2.5 on a four-point scale or the equivalent on all
- 8 course work previously attempted; or
- 9 (D) if sufficient money is available, meet the
- 10 eligibility criteria described by Section 56.304(a)(2)(A);
- 11 (3) meet financial need requirements established by
- 12 the coordinating board;
- 13 (4) be enrolled in an undergraduate degree or
- 14 certificate program at an eligible institution;
- 15 (5) except as provided under rules adopted under
- 16 Section 56.304(h), be enrolled as:
- 17 (A) an entering undergraduate student for at
- 18 least three-fourths of a full course load, as determined by the
- 19 coordinating board, not later than the 16th month after the
- 20 calendar month in which the person graduated from high school;
- 21 (B) an entering undergraduate student who
- 22 entered military service not later than the first anniversary of
- 23 the date the person graduated from high school and who enrolled for
- 24 at least three-fourths of a full course load, as determined by the
- 25 coordinating board, at the eligible institution not later than 12
- 26 months after being honorably discharged from military service;
- (C) a continuing undergraduate student for at

- 1 least three-fourths of a full course load, as determined by the
- 2 coordinating board, not later than the 12th month after the
- 3 calendar month in which the person received an associate degree
- 4 from a public or private institution of higher education; or
- 5 (D) an undergraduate student described by
- 6 Subdivision (2)(C) who has never previously received a TEXAS grant;
- 7 (6) have applied for any available financial aid or
- 8 assistance; and
- 9 (7) comply with any additional nonacademic
- 10 requirements adopted by the coordinating board under this
- 11 subchapter.
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 56.305, Education Code, is amended by
- 13 adding Subsection (e-2) to read as follows:
- 14 (e-2) For purposes of this section, a person who is
- 15 initially awarded a TEXAS grant during or after the 2017 fall
- 16 semester makes satisfactory academic progress toward an
- 17 undergraduate degree or certificate only if:
- 18 (1) in the person's first academic year the person
- 19 meets the satisfactory academic progress requirements of the
- 20 <u>institution at which the person is enrolled; and</u>
- 21 (2) in a subsequent academic year, the person:
- (A) completed at least 30 semester credit hours
- 23 <u>in the student's most recent academic year; and</u>
- 24 (B) has earned an overall grade point average of
- 25 at least 2.5 on a four-point scale or the equivalent on coursework
- 26 previously attempted at institutions of higher education.
- 27 SECTION 4. Section 56.307, Education Code, is amended by

- 1 amending Subsection (f), adding Subsection (f-1), and amending
- 2 Subsection (j) to read as follows:
- 3 (f) The amount of a TEXAS grant may not be reduced by any
- 4 gift aid for which the person receiving the grant is eligible, other
- 5 than a federal Pell Grant, unless the total amount of a person's
- 6 grant plus any gift aid received exceeds the student's financial
- 7 need.
- 8 (f-1) The amount of a TEXAS grant may not exceed the
- 9 student's total cost of tuition and fees, plus a book stipend.
- 10 (j) A public institution of higher education shall use other
- 11 available sources of financial aid, other than a loan or
- 12 participation in a work-study program, to cover any difference in
- 13 the amount of a TEXAS grant awarded to the student and the actual
- 14 amount of tuition and required fees at the institution if the
- 15 difference results from:
- 16 (1) a reduction in the amount of a TEXAS grant under
- 17 Subsection (i-1); or
- 18 (2) a deficiency in the amount of the grant as
- 19 established under Subsection (a) or (e), as applicable, to cover
- 20 the full amount of tuition and required fees charged to the student
- 21 by the institution.
- 22 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies
- 23 beginning with initial or subsequent TEXAS grants awarded for the
- 24 2017 fall semester. Initial or subsequent TEXAS grants awarded for
- 25 a semester or term before the 2017 fall semester are governed by the
- 26 applicable law in effect immediately before the effective date of
- 27 this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that

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- 1 purpose.
- 2 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
