## S.B. No. 73

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to leave policy and procedures for state employees.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 661, Government Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Subchapter H to read as follows:
- 6 <u>SUBCHAPTER H. STATE AGENCY LEAVE POLICY</u>
- 7 Sec. 661.251. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "state
- 8 agency" has the meaning assigned by Section 661.001.
- 9 Sec. 661.252. AGENCY POLICY. (a) A state agency shall
- 10 adopt a policy governing leave for employees under this chapter.
- 11 (b) The policy must provide clear and objective guidelines
- 12 to establish under what circumstances an employee of the agency may
- 13 be entitled to or granted each type of leave provided by this
- 14 <u>chapter.</u>
- 15 (c) The state agency shall post the policy adopted under
- 16 this section on the agency's Internet website in a location easily
- 17 accessible by the agency's employees and the public.
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 661.902, Government Code, is amended by
- 19 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 20 follows:
- 21 (b) The administrative head of an agency may determine that
- 22 a reason other than <u>a reason</u> [that] described by Subsection (a) is
- 23 sufficient for granting emergency leave. Subject to the provisions
- 24 of this subsection, the administrative head [and] shall grant an

- 1 emergency leave to an employee who the administrative head
- 2 determines has shown good cause for taking emergency leave. The
- 3 administrative head may not grant an emergency leave to an employee
- 4 under this subsection unless the administrative head believes in
- 5 good faith that the employee being granted the emergency leave
- 6 intends to return to the employee's position with the agency on
- 7 expiration of the period of emergency leave.
- 8 (c) Not later than October 1 of each year, the
- 9 <u>administrative</u> head of an agency shall report to the comptroller
- 10 the name and position of each employee of the agency who was granted
- 11 more than 32 hours of emergency leave during the previous state
- 12 fiscal year, the reason for which the employee was granted the
- 13 emergency leave, and the total number of hours of emergency leave
- 14 granted to the employee in that state fiscal year.
- 15 SECTION 3. Subchapter C, Chapter 2101, Government Code, is
- 16 amended by adding Section 2101.042 to read as follows:
- Sec. 2101.042. LEAVE REPORTING. (a) As part of the
- 18 centralized accounting and payroll system or any successor system
- 19 used to implement the enterprise resource planning component of the
- 20 uniform statewide accounting project developed under Sections
- 21 <u>2101.031</u>, 2101.035, and 2101.036, the comptroller shall adopt a
- 22 uniform system for use by each state agency to report leave taken by
- 23 the agency's employees. The system adopted by the comptroller must
- 24 include standardized accounting codes for each type of leave
- 25 authorized under Chapter 661.
- 26 (b) Each state agency shall use the uniform system adopted
- 27 by the comptroller under this section.

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 661.902(b), Government Code, as amended
- 2 by this Act, applies only to a grant of emergency leave made on or
- 3 after the effective date of this Act. A grant of emergency leave
- 4 made before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 5 effect on the date the emergency leave was granted, and the former
- 6 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 7 SECTION 5. The first report required under Section
- 8 661.902(c), Government Code, as added by this Act, is due October 1,
- 9 2017, and must cover the period from September 1, 2016, to August
- 10 31, 2017.
- 11 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
