 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to the disposition of state surplus or salvage data
 1-22 processing equipment by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Section 497.012(b), Government Code, is amended
 1-25 to read as follows:

1-26 (b) If the department determines that it is economically
 1-27 feasible, the department shall repair or refurbish the surplus or
 1-28 salvage data processing equipment. The department shall sell the
 1-29 repaired or refurbished data processing equipment, in the following
 1-30 order of preference, to:

- 1-31 (1) a school district;
- 1-32 (2) [] a state agency;
- 1-33 (3) [~~or~~] a political subdivision of the state; or
- 1-34 (4) a statewide organization described by Section
 1-35 264.603(a), Family Code, or a local volunteer advocate program, as
 1-36 defined by Section 264.601, Family Code, for use by children or
 1-37 youth in foster care [~~in that relative order of preference~~].

1-38 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
