

AN ACT

relating to the operations of the Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas; authorizing a trust company to charge the institute an investment fee.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 572.003(c), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

(c) The term means a member of:

- (1) the Public Utility Commission of Texas;

12 SECTION 2. Section 102.003, Health and Safety Code, is  
13 amended to read as follows:

14 Sec. 102.003. SUNSET PROVISION. The Cancer Prevention and  
15 Research Institute of Texas is subject to Chapter 325, Government  
16 Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided  
17 by that chapter, the institute is abolished and this chapter  
18 expires September 1, 2023 [~~2021~~].

19 SECTION 3. Section 102.107, Health and Safety Code, is  
20 amended to read as follows:

21 Sec. 102.107. POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The oversight  
22 committee shall:

- 23 (1) hire a chief executive officer;
- 24 (2) annually set priorities as prescribed by the
- 25 legislature for each grant program that receives money under this
- 26 chapter; and
- 27 (3) consider the priorities set under Subdivision (2)

1 in awarding grants under this chapter.

2 (b) The oversight committee may conduct a closed meeting in  
3 accordance with Subchapter E, Chapter 551, Government Code, to  
4 discuss issues related to managing, acquiring, or selling  
5 securities or other revenue-sharing obligations realized under the  
6 standards established as required by Section 102.256.

7 SECTION 4. Section 102.203(e), Health and Safety Code, is  
8 amended to read as follows:

9 (e) Not more than 10 percent of the money appropriated by  
10 the legislature for grants in a state fiscal year [~~awarded under~~  
11 ~~this subchapter~~] may be used for cancer prevention and control  
12 programs during that [~~any~~] year.

13 SECTION 5. Section 102.254, Health and Safety Code, is  
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Sec. 102.254. PERIOD FOR AWARDS. The oversight committee  
16 may not award money under Subchapter E [~~before January 1, 2008, or~~  
17 after August 31, 2022 [~~2020~~].

18 SECTION 6. Section 102.256, Health and Safety Code, is  
19 amended by adding Subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:

20 (c) The oversight committee may transfer its management and  
21 disposition authority over the state's interest in securities,  
22 equities, royalties, income, and other benefits realized as a  
23 result of projects undertaken with money awarded under Subchapter E  
24 to the Texas Treasury Safekeeping Trust Company. If the oversight  
25 committee transfers management and disposition authority under  
26 this subsection, the trust company has any power necessary to  
27 accomplish the purposes of this section.

1        (d) In managing the assets described by Subsection (c)  
2 through procedures and subject to restrictions that the Texas  
3 Treasury Safekeeping Trust Company considers appropriate, the  
4 trust company may acquire, exchange, sell, supervise, manage, or  
5 retain any kind of investment that a prudent investor, exercising  
6 reasonable care, skill, and caution, would acquire, exchange, sell,  
7 or retain in light of the purposes, terms, distribution  
8 requirements, and other circumstances then prevailing pertinent to  
9 each investment, including the requirements prescribed by  
10 Subsection (b) and the purposes described by Section 102.002. The  
11 trust company may charge a fee to recover the reasonable and  
12 necessary costs incurred in managing assets under this section.

13        SECTION 7. Section 102.101(f), Health and Safety Code, is  
14 repealed.

15        SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
