15	(3) "Governmental contract" means a contract awarded

20	(4) "Governmental entity" has the meaning assigned by

22	Sec. 2252.152. CONTRACTS WITH COMPANIES ENGAGED IN BUSINESS
23	WITH IRAN, SUDAN, OR FOREIGN TERRORIST ORGANIZATION PROHIBITED. A

1	a company that is identified on a list prepared and maintained under
2	Section 806.051, 807.051, or 2252.153.
3	Sec. 2252.153. LISTED COMPANIES. The comptroller shall
4	prepare and maintain, and make available to each governmental
5	entity, a list of companies known to have contracts with or provide
6	supplies or services to a foreign terrorist organization.
7	SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 2252, Government Code, as
8	added by this Act, applies only to a contract or purchase for which
9	a governmental entity first advertises or otherwise solicits bids,
10	proposals, offers, or qualifications on or after the effective date

11 of this Act.

12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
