- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2157.068, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (k) to read as follows:
- 7 (k) The department, in cooperation with state agencies,
- 8 shall, with respect to the purchase of commodity items included in
- 9 the list maintained under Subsection (e):
- 10 (1) periodically assess the risk to this state in the
- 11 purchase of those commodity items; and
- 12 (2) based on that risk assessment and as the
- 13 department considers necessary to ensure accuracy, monitor and
- 14 verify the purchase transaction reports of the monthly sales of
- 15 those commodity items submitted by vendors in accordance with
- 16 department requirements.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 2155.504(a), Government Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:

- 19 (a) Except as provided by this subsection, a [A] state
- 20 agency or local government may purchase goods or services directly
- 21 from a vendor under a contract listed on a schedule developed under
- 22 this subchapter. A state agency or local government contracting
- 23 for the purchase of an automated information system shall comply
- 24 with Section 2157.068(e-1). A purchase authorized by this section

- 1 satisfies any requirement of state law relating to competitive bids
- 2 or proposals [and satisfies any applicable requirements of Chapter
- $3 \frac{2157}{1}$.
- 4 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only in
- 5 relation to a contract:
- 6 (1) for which a state agency or local government first
- 7 advertises or otherwise solicits bids, proposals, offers, or
- 8 qualifications on or after the effective date of this Act;
- 9 (2) that is extended on or after the effective date of
- 10 this Act; or
- 11 (3) for which a change order is submitted on or after
- 12 the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
