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1 AN ACT relating to the compensatory time and overtime pay for commissioned 2 3 officers of the Department of Public Safety. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. The heading to Section 411.016, Government Code, 5 6 is amended to read as follows: 7 Sec. 411.016. COMPENSATORY TIME; OVERTIME [SUPPLEMENTAL] 8 PAY. SECTION 2. Section 411.016, Government Code, is amended by 9 amending Subsections (b), (c), and (e) and adding Subsections (b-1) 10 and (f) to read as follows: 11 12 (b) If, during a 24-hour period [calendar week], the total 13 number of hours worked by a commissioned officer equals [plus the number of hours of leave taken for which the officer is entitled to 14 15 compensation, including approved sick leave, vacation, holiday, holiday compensatory time, emergency leave, administrative leave, 16 17 and jury duty, equal] more than eight [40] hours, the excess is overtime. [For each calendar month, the overtime for each week 18 ending during that month shall be totaled. If the total overtime 19 for the month exceeds eight hours, the officer may receive, in 20 addition to the officer's regular monthly salary, a supplement 21 22 determined as follows: 23 [(1) a commissioned officer who accumulates more 24 eight hours but less than 16 hours of overtime in a calendar month

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may receive five percent of the officer's regular monthly salary; 1 [(2) a commissioned officer who accumulated 16 or more 2 hours but less than 32 hours of overtime in a calendar month may 3 receive 10 percent of the officer's regular monthly salary; and 4 5 [(3) a commissioned officer who accumulated 32 or more hours of overtime in a calendar month may receive 15 percent of the 6 7 officer's regular monthly salary.] (b-1) If, during a work week, the total number of hours 8 worked by a commissioned officer equals more than 40 hours, the 9 10 excess is overtime. [The formula prescribed by Subsection (b) is the 11 (c) exclusive method of computing state compensation for overtime 12 entitlements.] This section applies only to the computation of 13 overtime entitlements and does not apply to the method of 14 compensating a commissioned officer for working on regularly 15 16 scheduled state holidays. 17 (e) The department may compensate an officer commissioned 18 by the department for the overtime earned by the officer by: (1) allowing or requiring the officer to take 19 compensatory leave at the rate of 1-1/2 hours of leave for each hour 20 of overtime earned; or 21 (2) paying the officer for the overtime hours earned 22 at the rate equal to 1-1/2 times the officer's regular hourly pay 23 rate [If the funds appropriated to the department to provide 24 25 supplemental pay are insufficient to pay all earned overtime 26 entitlements, the director may provide for compensatory time to be 27 taken during the biennium in which the entitlements are earned].

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1 (f) If a conflict exists between this section and Section 2 <u>659.015</u>, this section controls.

3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
