A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the compensatory time and overtime pay for commissioned

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 411.016, Government Code,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 411.016. COMPENSATORY TIME; OVERTIME [SUPPLEMENTAL]
- 8 PAY.

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- 9 SECTION 2. Section 411.016, Government Code, is amended by
- 10 amending Subsections (b), (c), and (e) and adding Subsections (b-1)
- 11 and (f) to read as follows:
- 12 (b) If, during a 24-hour period [calendar week], the total
- 13 number of hours worked by a commissioned officer equals [plus the
- 14 number of hours of leave taken for which the officer is entitled to
- 15 compensation, including approved sick leave, vacation, holiday,
- 16 holiday compensatory time, emergency leave, administrative leave,
- 17 $\frac{\text{and jury duty, equal}}{\text{more than eight}}$ [40] hours, the excess is

[For each calendar month, the overtime for each week

- 19 ending during that month shall be totaled. If the total overtime
- 20 for the month exceeds eight hours, the officer may receive, in
- 21 addition to the officer's regular monthly salary, a supplement
- 22 determined as follows:

overtime.

- [(1) a commissioned officer who accumulates more than
- 24 eight hours but less than 16 hours of overtime in a calendar month

- 1 may receive five percent of the officer's regular monthly salary;
- 2 [(2) a commissioned officer who accumulated 16 or more
- 3 hours but less than 32 hours of overtime in a calendar month may
- 4 receive 10 percent of the officer's regular monthly salary; and
- 5 [(3) a commissioned officer who accumulated 32 or more
- 6 hours of overtime in a calendar month may receive 15 percent of the
- 7 officer's regular monthly salary.
- 8 (b-1) If, during a work week, the total number of hours
- 9 worked by a commissioned officer equals more than 40 hours, the
- 10 excess is overtime.
- 11 (c) [The formula prescribed by Subsection (b) is the
- 12 exclusive method of computing state compensation for overtime
- 13 entitlements.] This section applies only to the computation of
- 14 overtime entitlements and does not apply to the method of
- 15 compensating a commissioned officer for working on regularly
- 16 scheduled state holidays.
- 17 (e) The department may compensate an officer commissioned
- 18 by the department for the overtime earned by the officer by:
- 19 (1) allowing or requiring the officer to take
- 20 compensatory leave at the rate of 1-1/2 hours of leave for each hour
- 21 of overtime earned; or
- 22 (2) paying the officer for the overtime hours earned
- 23 at the rate equal to 1-1/2 times the officer's regular hourly pay
- 24 rate [If the funds appropriated to the department to provide
- 25 supplemental pay are insufficient to pay all earned overtime
- 26 entitlements, the director may provide for compensatory time to be
- 27 taken during the biennium in which the entitlements are earned].

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- 1 (f) If a conflict exists between this section and Section
- 2 <u>659.015</u>, this section controls.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
