A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the age at which a person may purchase aerosol paint.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 485.017, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	Sec. 485.017. SIGNS. A business establishment that sells
7	an abusable volatile chemical at retail shall display a conspicuous
8	sign, in English and Spanish, that states the following:
9	It is unlawful for a person to sell or deliver an
10	abusable volatile chemical, other than aerosol paint,
11	to a person under 18 years of age. Except in limited
12	situations, such an offense is a state jail felony.
13	It is unlawful for a person to sell or deliver
14	aerosol paint to a person under 21 years of age. Except
15	in limited situations, such an offense is a state jail
16	felony.
17	It is also unlawful for a person to abuse a
18	volatile chemical by inhaling, ingesting, applying,
19	using, or possessing with intent to inhale, ingest,
20	apply, or use a volatile chemical in a manner designed
21	to affect the central nervous system. Such an offense
22	is a Class B misdemeanor.
23	SECTION 2. Section 485.019(b), Health and Safety Code, is
24	amended to read as follows:

- 1 (b) This section does not apply to a business establishment
- 2 that has in place a computerized checkout system at the point of
- 3 sale for merchandise that alerts the cashier that a person
- 4 purchasing aerosol paint must be over 21 [18] years of age.
- 5 SECTION 3. The heading to Section 485.032, Health and
- 6 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 485.032. <u>PROHIBITED</u> DELIVERY [TO A MINOR].
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 485.032, Health and Safety Code, is
- 9 amended by amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsections
- 10 (a-1) and (c-1) to read as follows:
- 11 (a) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly
- 12 delivers an abusable volatile chemical, other than aerosol paint,
- 13 to a person who is younger than 18 years of age.
- 14 (a-1) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly
- 15 delivers aerosol paint to a person who is younger than 21 years of
- 16 <u>age</u>.
- 17 (c) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under
- 18 Subsection (a) [this section] that:
- 19 (1) the <u>actor</u> [<u>person making the delivery</u>] is <u>at least</u>
- 20 18 years of age and has [an adult having] supervisory
- 21 responsibility over the person younger than 18 years of age and:
- (A) the actor [adult] permits the use of the
- 23 abusable volatile chemical only under the <u>actor's</u> [adult's] direct
- 24 supervision and in the actor's [adult's] presence and only for its
- 25 intended purpose; and
- 26 (B) the actor [adult] removes the chemical from
- 27 the person younger than 18 years of age on completion of that use;

- 2 (2) the person to whom the abusable volatile chemical 3 was delivered presented to the actor [defendant] an apparently
- 4 valid Texas driver's license or an identification certificate,
- 5 issued by the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas and
- 6 containing a physical description consistent with the person's
- 7 appearance, that purported to establish that the person was 18
- 8 years of age or older.
- 9 <u>(c-1)</u> It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under
- 10 Subsection (a-1) that:
- 11 (1) the actor is at least 21 years of age and has
- 12 supervisory responsibility over the person younger than 21 years of
- 13 age and:
- 14 (A) the actor permits the use of the aerosol
- 15 paint only under the actor's direct supervision and in the actor's
- 16 presence and only for its intended purpose; and
- 17 (B) the actor removes the aerosol paint from the
- 18 person younger than 21 years of age on completion of that use; or
- 19 (2) the person to whom the aerosol paint was delivered
- 20 presented to the actor an apparently valid Texas driver's license
- 21 or an identification certificate, issued by the Department of
- 22 Public Safety of the State of Texas and containing a physical
- 23 description consistent with the person's appearance, that
- 24 purported to establish that the person was 21 years of age or older.
- 25 SECTION 5. Section 485.035, Health and Safety Code, is
- 26 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to
- 27 read as follows:

- 1 (a) A person commits an offense if the person sells an
- 2 abusable volatile chemical, other than aerosol paint, in violation
- 3 of Section 485.011 and the purchaser is 18 years of age or older.
- 4 (a-1) A person commits an offense if the person sells
- 5 aerosol paint in violation of Section 485.011 and the purchaser is
- 6 21 years of age or older.
- 7 SECTION 6. (a) The changes in law made by this Act to
- 8 Chapter 485, Health and Safety Code, apply only to an offense
- 9 committed on or after the effective date of this Act. For purposes
- 10 of this subsection, an offense is committed before the effective
- 11 date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs before that
- 12 date.
- 13 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 14 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was
- 15 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 16 purpose.
- 17 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
