5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 116 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 116. PROVIDING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES PROHIBITED
9	Sec. 116.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Health care practitioner" means an individual
11	issued a license, certificate, registration, title, permit, or
12	other authorization under this title to engage in a health care
13	profession.
14	(2) "Licensing entity" means a department,
15	commission, board, office, authority, or other agency of the state
16	that regulates health care practitioners under this title.
17	Sec. 116.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to
18	a health care practitioner who is authorized to:
19	(1) administer anesthesia or provide anesthesia
20	services in an outpatient setting, including the health care
21	practitioner's office; or
22	(2) prescribe or administer a prescription drug, as
23	defined by Section 551.003.
24	Sec. 116.003. PROVIDING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE PROHIBITED.

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(a) Except as otherwise provided by Subsection (b), a health care 1 2 practitioner or an employee or agent of a health care practitioner may not provide or otherwise make available to a patient or to a 3 person accompanying the patient in the health care practitioner's 4 office, including the patient's parent or guardian, an alcoholic 5 beverage subject to regulation under the Alcoholic Beverage Code. 6 7 (b) This section does not apply to alcohol when used as, or contained in, a drug for the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, 8 9 treatment, or prevention of illness, injury, or disease. 10 (c) A licensing entity may adopt rules necessary to 11 implement this chapter. Sec. 116.004. IMPOSITION OF ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY. The 12 13 appropriate licensing entity may impose an administrative penalty against a health care practitioner who violates Section 116.003 or 14 a rule or order adopted under that section. 15 16 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
