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1 (I) school employee wellness; 2 appropriate grade levels and methods of instruction for human sexuality instruction; 3 (4)4 strategies for integrating the 5 components specified by Subdivision (2) with the following elements in a coordinated school health program for the district: 6 7 (A) school health services; counseling and guidance services; (B) 8 9 a safe and healthy school environment; and 10 school employee wellness; and if feasible, joint use agreements or strategies 11 (5) for collaboration between the school district and community 12 organizations or agencies. 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 15 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
