- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 130.006, Local Government Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:

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- 7 Sec. 130.006. PROCEDURES FOR COLLECTION OF DISHONORED
- 8 CHECKS AND INVOICES. (a) A county tax assessor-collector may
- 9 establish procedures for the collection of dishonored checks and
- 10 credit card invoices. The procedures may include:
- 11 (1) official notification to the maker that the check
- 12 or invoice has not been honored and that the receipt, registration,
- 13 certificate, or other instrument issued on the receipt of the check
- 14 or invoice is not valid until payment of the fee or tax is made;
- 15 (2) notification of the sheriff or other law
- 16 enforcement officers that a check or credit card invoice has not
- 17 been honored and that the receipt, registration, certificate, or
- 18 other instrument held by the maker is not valid; [and]
- 19 (3) notification to the Texas Department of Motor
- 20 Vehicles, the comptroller of public accounts, or the Department of
- 21 Public Safety that the receipt, registration, certificate, or other
- 22 instrument held by the maker is not valid; and
- 23 (4) referral of a dishonored check or credit card
- 24 invoice to a private collection agency.

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(b) If the county tax assessor-collector refers a 1 2 dishonored check or credit card invoice to a private collection agency under Subsection (a)(4), the private collection agency may 3 charge a fee to the person responsible for the check or invoice in 4 5 an amount equal to any amount authorized for a returned check under 6 Section 118.011. 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10

Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
