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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a study and report concerning faculty productivity at general academic teaching institutions. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 51, Education Code, is 5 amended by adding Section 51.4033 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 51.4033. STUDY AND REPORT REGARDING 7 FACULTY PRODUCTIVITY. (a) In this section: 8 (1) "Faculty member" means a person who is employed 9 full time by a general academic teaching institution as a member of 10 the faculty whose primary duties include teaching or research. The 11 term does not include: 12 13 (A) a person employed in the classified personnel 14 system of the institution or a person employed in a similar type of position if the institution does not have a classified personnel 15 16 system; or (B) a person who holds faculty rank but who 17 spends a majority of the person's time for the institution engaged 18 in managerial or supervisory activities, including a chancellor, 19 vice chancellor, president, vice president, provost, associate or 20 21 assistant provost, dean, or associate or assistant dean. (2) "General academic teaching institution," 22 "governing board," and "university system" have the meanings 23 24 assigned by Section 61.003.

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1 (b) To ensure the best use of state funds and the delivery of high-quality postsecondary education to students in this state, 2 each general academic teaching institution shall conduct a study to 3 determine whether tenured faculty members are making a significant 4 5 professional contribution to their employing institutions or to the academic community. The study must cover the five-year period 6 ending August 31, 2017, and include data regarding the number of 7 8 tenured faculty members who during that period did not achieve any of the following performance benchmarks: 9 10 (1) teaching a class at the institution; 11 (2) actively conducting sponsored or 12 institution-funded research at the institution; (3) authoring an article that is in the faculty 13 14 member's academic field and published by a major peer-reviewed 15 academic journal, as identified for the purpose of the study by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under Subsection (c); or 16 17 (4) making a significant written contribution to a published book in the faculty member's academic field. 18 19 (c) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall identify, with respect to each academic field taught in a general 20 academic teaching institution, all major peer-reviewed academic 21 journals and shall make that information available on the board's 22 Internet website not later than November 1, 2017. A general 23 24 academic teaching institution may recommend one or more journals for inclusion in the journals identified by the coordinating board. 25 26 (d) The governing board of a general academic teaching institution may appoint a committee to conduct the study required 27

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1 by this section. A university system may conduct the study for one 2 or more of the system's component institutions or may direct a component institution to conduct the study with respect to that 3 institution and to submit its report in a timely manner to the 4 5 university system administration. 6 (e) Each general academic teaching institution or 7 university system, as applicable, shall prepare a report based on 8 the study required by Subsection (b). The institution or system shall submit the report to the coordinating board not later than 9 August 1, 2018. The coordinating board may adopt standards 10 governing the form and content of the reports. The coordinating 11 12 board shall compile the reports submitted to the board under this subsection and, not later than December 1, 2018, shall submit the 13 compilation to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker 14 of the house of representatives, and the presiding officer of each 15 legislative standing committee with primary jurisdiction over 16 17 higher education.

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(f) This section expires January 1, 2019.

19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
