A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to authorization by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board for certain public junior colleges to offer 3 early childhood education baccalaureate degree programs. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 130.0012, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsections (b-4), (b-5), (b-6), and (g-1) and amending 7 8 Subsection (g) to read as follows: 9 (b-4) The coordinating board shall authorize a baccalaureate degree program in early childhood education at each 10 public junior college located in a county with a population of 2.2 11 million or more and adjacent to a county with a population of more 12 than 600,000 if: 13 14 (1) the county in which the public junior college is located has a demonstrated initial need for at least 2,400 early 15 16 childhood educators based on the number of unserved children eligible for public early childhood education, assuming, only for 17 purposes of calculating the need, a student to teacher ratio of 12 18 <u>to 1;</u> 19 20 (2) the degree program curriculum is approved by the independent school districts located in the county that 21 collectively represent at least 51 percent of the student 22 23 population enrolled in kindergarten through 12th grade; and 24 (3) one of the following:

(A) before November 1, 2017, a regional public 1 2 university located in the county in which the public junior college 3 is located or an immediately adjacent county is unable to obtain the approval of the independent school districts located in the county 4 5 in which the public junior college is located that collectively represent at least 51 percent of the student population enrolled in 6 7 kindergarten through 12th grade for a detailed plan to: 8 (i) expand degree output of early childhood and elementary certified teachers to collectively meet the 9 three-year average hiring demands of the independent school 10 districts located in the county in which the public junior college 11 12 is located and immediately adjacent counties, including producing more prekindergarten teachers to support the planned increases in 13 prekindergarten enrollment for all public schools; 14 15 (ii) implement an early childhood education 16 curriculum; and 17 (iii) fund the expansion of current or development of new early childhood education programs, which does 18 19 not include state funding for new facilities; or (B) before September 1, 2019, a regional public 20 university that received the approval of independent school 21 districts as described by Paragraph (A) is unable to demonstrate: 22 23 (i) the necessary current student 24 enrollment to produce sufficient early childhood and elementary certified teachers within the next four years to meet the existing 25 26 hiring demands of the independent school districts located in the county in which the public junior college is located and 27

2	averages, including producing more prekindergarten teachers to

5	(ii) implementation of an early childhood
6	education curriculum meeting the expressed needs of the independent
7	school districts located in the county in which the public junior
8	college is located that collectively represent at least 51 percent

11	(b-5) A degree program created under Subsection (b-4) may
12	not be authorized by the State Board for Educator Certification
13	under Chapter 21 for a certification field above the third grade
14	level.
15	(b-6) The coordinating board may not subsequently terminate
16	authorization to offer an early childhood baccalaureate degree
17	program granted under Subsection (b-4) on the ground that
18	implementation of the degree program reduces the workforce need to
19	a level that is below the minimal threshold specified in Subsection
20	<u>(b-4)(1)</u> .
21	(g) <u>Except as provided by Subsection (g-1), in</u> [In] its
22	recommendations to the legislature relating to state funding for
23	public junior colleges, the coordinating board shall recommend that
24	a public junior college receive substantially the same state
25	support for junior-level and senior-level courses offered under
26	this section as that provided to a general academic teaching
27	institution for substantially similar courses. In determining the

1 contact hours attributable to students enrolled in a junior-level or senior-level course offered under this section used to determine 2 3 а public junior college's proportionate share of state appropriations under Section 130.003, the coordinating board shall 4 5 weigh those contact hours as necessary to provide the junior college the appropriate level of state support to the extent state 6 funds for those courses are included in the appropriations. 7 This 8 subsection does not prohibit the legislature from directly appropriating state funds to support junior-level and senior-level 9 courses offered under this section. 10

11 (g-1) A degree program created under Subsection (b-4) may be 12 funded only by a public junior college's proportionate share of 13 state appropriations under Section 130.003, local funds, and 14 private sources. This subsection does not require the legislature 15 to appropriate state funds to support a degree program created 16 under Subsection (b-4).

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
