A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT
relating to information regarding autism spectrum disorders.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, is amended
by adding Subchapter X to read as follows:
SUBCHAPTER X. INFORMATION REGARDING AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS
Sec. 161.701. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
(1) "Autism spectrum disorder" has the meaning
assigned by Section 1355.001, Insurance Code.
(2) "Health care provider" has the meaning assigned by
<u>Section 34.001.</u>
Sec. 161.702. INFORMATION REGARDING AUTISM SPECTRUM
DISORDERS. (a) The department shall make available information
regarding autism spectrum disorders that includes:
(1) information addressing physical, developmental,
educational, and psychosocial outcomes, behavioral safety
concerns, life expectancy, clinical course, and intellectual and
functional development for individuals with an autism spectrum
disorder;
(2) information regarding available treatment options
for individuals with an autism spectrum disorder;
(3) contact information for national and local autism
spectrum disorder education and support programs, services, and
organizations, including organizations in Houston, Dallas, San

- 1 Antonio, and Austin, and information hotlines, resource centers,
- 2 and clearinghouses; and
- 3 (4) any other information required by the department.
- 4 (b) The information described by Subsection (a) must be:
- 5 (1) current, evidence-based information that has been
- 6 reviewed by medical experts and local autism spectrum disorder
- 7 <u>organizations; and</u>
- 8 (2) published in English and Spanish.
- 9 (c) The department shall make the information described by
- 10 Subsection (a) available on the department's Internet website in a
- 11 format that may be easily printed. The department may provide the
- 12 information described by Subsection (a) in writing to health care
- 13 providers if the department determines that providing written
- 14 information is cost-effective.
- Sec. 161.703. DUTY OF HEALTH CARE PROVIDER. (a) A health
- 16 <u>care provider who administers or causes to be administered a test</u>
- 17 for an autism spectrum disorder or who initially diagnoses a child
- 18 with an autism spectrum disorder shall provide the information
- 19 described by Section 161.702 to a parent of a child who receives:
- 20 (1) a test result indicating a probability or
- 21 diagnosis that the child has an autism spectrum disorder; or
- 22 (2) a diagnosis of an autism spectrum disorder.
- 23 (b) In addition to providing the information described by
- 24 Subsection (a), a health care provider may provide additional
- 25 information about autism spectrum disorders that is current and
- 26 evidence-based and has been reviewed by medical experts and
- 27 national autism spectrum disorder organizations.

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- 1 (c) Notwithstanding any other law, this section does not
- 2 <u>impose a standard of care or create an obligation or duty that</u>
- 3 provides a basis for a cause of action against a health care
- 4 provider. A health care provider may not be held civilly or
- 5 criminally liable for failing to provide information as required by
- 6 Subsection (a).
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
