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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to the notice of intention to issue certificates of 3 obligation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 271.049, Local Government Code, is 6 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), and (d) and adding 7 Subsections (e), (f), and (g) to read as follows:

8 (a) Regardless of the sources of payment of certificates, 9 certificates may not be issued unless the issuer publishes notice 10 of its intention to issue the certificates. The notice must be 11 published:

12 (1) once a week for two consecutive weeks in a 13 newspaper, as defined by Subchapter C, Chapter 2051, Government 14 Code, that is of general circulation in the area of the issuer, with 15 the date of the first publication to be before the 30th day before 16 the date tentatively set for the passage of the order or ordinance 17 authorizing the issuance of the certificates; and

18 (2) continuously on the issuer's Internet website, or 19 on a website as authorized by Subsection (f)(2), for at least 30 20 days before the date tentatively set for the passage of the order or 21 ordinance authorizing the issuance of the certificates and until 22 the first day after the date the issuer adopts the order or 23 ordinance.

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(b) The notice must state:

No. 553 1 (1) the time and place tentatively set for the passage of the order or ordinance authorizing the issuance of 2 the 3 certificates; 4 (2) the [maximum amount and] purpose of the 5 certificates to be authorized; [and] 6 (3) the manner in which the certificates will be paid 7 for, whether by taxes, revenues, or a combination of the two; 8 (4) as of the date the issuer adopts the order or ordinance, the principal of all outstanding debt obligations of the 9 10 issuer; (5) as of the date the issuer adopts the order or 11 12 ordinance, the estimated remaining interest of all outstanding debt obligations of the issuer; 13 14 (6) as of the date the issuer adopts the order or 15 ordinance, the estimated combined principal and interest required to pay all outstanding debt obligations of the issuer on time and in 16 17 full; (7) the maximum principal of the certificates to be 18 19 authorized; and (8) the process by which a petition may be submitted 20 requesting an election on the issuance of the certificates, in the 21 22 following form: 23 "Five percent of the qualified voters of (name of issuer) may 24 petition to require an election to be held authorizing the issuance of certificates of obligation by delivering a signed petition to 25 the (insert "secretary or clerk" if the issuer is a municipality, or 26 "county clerk" if the issuer is a county) of (name of issuer) 27

1 before the date the governing body has set for the authorization of the certificates of obligation. Information about the requirements 2 of the petition may be obtained from the (insert "secretary or 3 clerk" if the issuer is a municipality, or "county clerk" if the 4 issuer is a county) of (name of issuer)."[-5 (d) This section does not apply to certificates issued for 6 7 the purposes described by Sections 271.056(1) - (3)8  $[\frac{271.056(1)-(4)}{271.056(1)}]$ . 9 (e) Except as provided by Subsection (f), an issuer shall 10 maintain or cause to be maintained an Internet website to comply with this section. 11 12 (f) This subsection does not apply to a county or municipality with a population of more than 2,000. If an issuer did 13 not maintain an Internet website or cause a website to be maintained 14 on January 1, 2017, the issuer shall post the information required 15 16 by Subsection (b) on: 17 (1) the issuer's website, if the issuer chooses to maintain the website or <u>cause the website to be maintained; or</u> 18 19 (2) a website in which the issuer controls the content of the posting, including a social media site, provided that the 20 information is easily found by searching the name of the issuer on 21 22 the Internet. (g) In this section, "debt obligation" means an issued 23 public security, as defined by Section 1201.002, Government Code, 24 25 secured by property taxes. SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act to Section 26 271.049, Local Government Code, apply only to a certificate of 27

obligation for which the first notice of intention to issue the certificate is made on or after the effective date of this Act. A certificate of obligation for which the first notice of intention to issue the certificate is made before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the notice of intention is made, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
