Section 571.0771, Government Code, is amended by 4 5 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows: 6 (d) Subsection (a) applies to a statement filed under Chapter 572 regardless of whether another person has filed a sworn 7 complaint pertaining to the statement. 8 SECTION 2. If the <u>commission</u> [executive director] determines that 15 (e) the commission has jurisdiction, the notice under 16 Section 571.123(b) must include: 17 (1) a statement that the commission has jurisdiction 18 over the violation of law alleged in the complaint; 19 (2) a statement of whether the complaint will be 20 21 processed as a Category One violation or a Category Two violation, 22 subject to reconsideration as provided for by Section 571.1212; (3) the date by which the respondent is required to 23 24 respond to the notice;

1 (4) a copy of the complaint and the rules of procedure 2 of the commission; 3 (5) a statement of the rights of the respondent; 4 a statement inviting the respondent to provide to (6) 5 the commission any information relevant to the complaint; and 6 (7) a statement that a failure to timely respond to the 7 notice will be treated as a separate violation. 8 (f) If the commission [executive director] determines that the commission does not have jurisdiction over the violation 9 10 alleged in the complaint, the commission [executive director] shall: 11 12 (1)dismiss the complaint; and not later than the fifth business day after the 13 (2) 14 date of the dismissal, send to the complainant and the respondent 15 written notice of the dismissal and the grounds for the dismissal. The commission may reverse the <u>commission's</u> [executive 8 (b) director's] determination under Section 571.124 only on the 9 affirmative vote of at least six members. 10 SECTION 5. Section 571.125, Government Code, is amended by 11 12 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows: 13 (f) Counsel for the respondent may subpoena a witness to a 14 preliminary review hearing in the same manner as an attorney may 15 issue a subpoena in a proceeding in a county or district court. SECTION 6. Section 571.130, Government Code, is amended by 16 17 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows: (f) Counsel for the respondent may subpoena a witness to a 18 19 formal hearing in the same manner as an attorney may issue a subpoena in a proceeding in a county or district court. 20 21 SECTION 7. Subchapter E, Chapter 571, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 571.1325 to read as follows: 22 23 Sec. 571.1325. TIME FOR FINAL RESOLUTION OF COMPLAINT. (a) 24 The commission shall finally resolve a complaint alleging a Category One violation not later than the first anniversary of the 25 26 date the complaint is filed. (b) The commission shall finally resolve a complaint 27

<u>alleging a Category Two violation not later than 18 months after the</u> <u>date the complaint is filed.</u>

3 SECTION 8. The changes in law made by this Act to Chapter 4 571, Government Code, apply only to the effect or resolution of a 5 complaint filed under that chapter on or after the effective date of 6 this Act. The effect or resolution of a complaint filed before the 7 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the 8 complaint was filed, and the former law is continued in effect for 9 that purpose.
