- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 12.104(b-2), Education Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (b-2) An open-enrollment charter school is subject to the
- 10 requirement to establish an individual graduation committee under
- 11 Section 28.0258. [This subsection expires September 1, 2017.]
- SECTION 2. Section 18.006(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 13 read as follows:
- 14 (b) In addition to other factors determined to be
- 15 appropriate by the commissioner, the accountability system must
- 16 include consideration of:
- 17 (1) student performance on the [end-of-course]
- 18 assessment instruments required by Section 39.023(c); and
- 19 (2) dropout rates, including dropout rates and diploma
- 20 program completion rates for the grade levels served by the diploma
- 21 program.
- SECTION 3. Section 25.005(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 23 read as follows:
- 24 (b) A reciprocity agreement must:

- 1 (1) address procedures for:
- 2 (A) transferring student records;
- 3 (B) awarding credit for completed course work;
- 4 and
- 5 (C) permitting a student to satisfy the
- 6 requirements of Section 39.025 through successful performance on
- 7 comparable [end-of-course or other exit-level] assessment
- 8 instruments administered in another state; and
- 9 (2) include appropriate criteria developed by the
- 10 agency.
- SECTION 4. Section 28.014(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 (a) Each school district shall partner with at least one
- 14 institution of higher education to develop and provide courses in
- 15 college preparatory mathematics and English language arts. The
- 16 courses must be designed:
- 17 (1) for students at the 12th grade level whose
- 18 performance on:
- 19 (A) an [end-of-course] assessment instrument
- 20 required under Section 39.023(c) does not meet college readiness
- 21 standards; or
- (B) coursework $\underline{\text{or}}[\tau]$ a college entrance
- 23 examination[, or an assessment instrument designated under Section
- 24 51.3062(c)] indicates that the student is not ready to perform
- 25 entry-level college coursework; and
- 26 (2) to prepare students for success in entry-level
- 27 college courses.

- SECTION 5. Section 28.0211(o), Education Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (o) This section does not require the administration of
- 4 a fifth [or eighth] grade assessment instrument in a subject under
- 5 Section 39.023(a) to a student enrolled in the fifth [or eighth]
- 6 grade[ras applicable r] if the student[:
- 7 $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$ is enrolled in a course in the subject intended
- 8 for students above the student's grade level and will be
- 9 administered an assessment instrument adopted or developed under
- 10 Section 39.023(a) that aligns with the curriculum for the course in
- 11 which the student is enrolled[; or
- 12 [(2) is enrolled in a course in the subject for which
- 13 the student will receive high school academic credit and will be
- 14 administered an end-of-course assessment instrument adopted under
- 15 Section 39.023(c) for the course].
- SECTION 6. Section 28.023(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 (c) A school district shall give a student in grade level
- 19 six or above credit for a subject on the basis of an examination for
- 20 credit in the subject approved by the board of trustees under
- 21 Subsection (a) if the student scores in the 80th percentile or above
- 22 on the examination or if the student achieves a score as provided by
- 23 Subsection (c-1). If a student is given credit in a subject on the
- 24 basis of an examination, the district shall enter the examination
- 25 score on the student's transcript and the student is not required to
- 26 take an [end-of-course] assessment instrument adopted under
- 27 Section 39.023(c) for that subject.

- 1 SECTION 7. Sections 28.025(b-4) and (c-6), Education Code,
- 2 are amended to read as follows:
- 3 (b-4) A school district may offer the curriculum described
- 4 in Subsections (b-1)(1) through (4) in an applied manner. Courses
- 5 delivered in an applied manner must cover the essential knowledge
- 6 and skills, and the student shall be administered the applicable
- 7 [end-of-course] assessment instrument as provided by Sections
- 8 39.023(c) and 39.025.
- 9 (c-6) Notwithstanding Subsection (c), a person may receive
- 10 a diploma if the person is eligible for a diploma under Section
- 11 28.0258. [This subsection expires September 1, 2017.]
- 12 SECTION 8. Section 28.0255, Education Code, is amended by
- 13 amending Subsections (g) and (h) and adding Subsection (g-1) to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (g) A student entering the ninth grade during the 2017-2018
- 16 <u>school year</u> is entitled to a high school diploma if the student:
- 17 (1) successfully complies with the curriculum
- 18 requirements specified under Subsection (e); and
- 19 (2) performs satisfactorily, as determined by the
- 20 commissioner under Subsection (h), on:
- 21 (A) end-of-course assessment instruments listed
- 22 under Section 39.023(c) for courses in which the student was
- 23 enrolled; and
- 24 (B) the mathematics and reading portions of the
- 25 Texas Success Initiative (TSI) diagnostic assessment required to be
- 26 administered under Section 39.023(c).
- 27 (g-1) A student other than a student described by Subsection

- 1 (g) is entitled to a high school diploma if the student:
- 2 (1) successfully complies with the curriculum
- 3 requirements specified under Subsection (e); and
- 4 (2) performs satisfactorily, as determined by the
- 5 commissioner under Subsection (h), on assessment instruments
- 6 listed under Section 39.023(c), as that section existed before
- 7 amendment by _.B. ___, Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
- 8 Session, 2017, for courses in which the student was enrolled.
- 9 (h) For purposes of Subsections [Subsection] (g)(2) and
- 10 (g-1)(2), the commissioner shall determine the level of
- 11 satisfactory performance on applicable [end-of-course] assessment
- 12 instruments administered to a student.
- SECTION 9. Section 28.0258, Education Code, is amended by
- 14 amending Subsections (a), (b), (e), (f), (h), (j), and (k) and
- 15 adding Subsection (m) to read as follows:
- 16 (a) This section applies only to an 11th or 12th grade
- 17 student who has failed to comply with the [end-of-course]
- 18 assessment instrument performance requirements under Section
- 19 39.025 for not more than two subjects identified under Section
- 20 <u>39.023(c)</u> [courses]. For purposes of this section, English I
- 21 writing, English II writing, and reading are considered separate
- 22 subjects.
- (b) For each student to whom this section applies, the
- 24 school district that the student attends shall establish an
- 25 individual graduation committee at the end of or after the
- 26 student's 11th grade year to determine whether the student may
- 27 qualify to graduate as provided by this section. A student may not

- 1 qualify to graduate under this section before the student's 12th
- 2 grade year. The committee shall be composed of:
- 3 (1) the principal or principal's designee;
- 4 (2) for each subject identified under Section
- 5 39.023(c) for [end-of-course assessment instrument on] which the

- 10 (3) the department chair or lead teacher supervising
- 11 the teacher described by Subdivision (2); and
- 12 (4) as applicable:
- 13 (A) the student's parent or person standing in
- 14 parental relation to the student;
- 15 (B) a designated advocate described by
- 16 Subsection (c) if the person described by Paragraph (A) is unable to
- 17 serve; or
- 18 (C) the student, at the student's option, if the
- 19 student is at least 18 years of age or is an emancipated minor.
- 20 (e) To be eligible to graduate and receive a high school
- 21 diploma under this section, a student must successfully complete
- 22 the curriculum requirements required for high school graduation:
- 23 (1) identified by the State Board of Education under
- 24 Section 28.025(a); or
- 25 (2) as otherwise provided by the transition plan
- 26 adopted by the commissioner to implement and administer the
- 27 amendments made by Chapter 211 (H.B. 5), Acts of the 83rd

- 1 Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, replacing the minimum,
- 2 recommended, and advanced high school programs with the foundation
- 3 high school program [under Section 28.025(h)].
- 4 (f) Notwithstanding any other law, a student's individual
- 5 graduation committee established under this section shall
- 6 recommend additional requirements by which the student may qualify
- 7 to graduate, including:
- 8 (1) additional remediation; and
- 9 (2) for each [end-of-course] assessment instrument
- 10 required under Section 39.023(c) on which the student failed to
- 11 perform satisfactorily:
- 12 (A) the completion of a project related to the
- 13 subject [area of the course] that demonstrates proficiency in the
- 14 subject [area]; or
- 15 (B) the preparation of a portfolio of work
- 16 samples in the subject [area of the course], including work samples
- 17 [from the course] that demonstrate proficiency in the subject
- 18 [area].
- 19 (h) In determining whether a student for whom an individual
- 20 graduation committee is established is qualified to graduate, the
- 21 committee shall consider:
- 22 (1) the recommendation of the student's teacher in
- 23 each course of the subject for which the student failed to perform
- 24 satisfactorily on an [end-of-course] assessment instrument;
- 25 (2) the student's grade in each course of the subject
- 26 for which the student failed to perform satisfactorily on an
- 27 [end-of-course] assessment instrument;

- 1 (3) the student's score on each [end-of-course]
- 2 assessment instrument required under Section 39.023(c) on which the
- 3 student failed to perform satisfactorily;
- 4 (4) the student's performance on any additional
- 5 requirements recommended by the committee under Subsection (f);
- 6 (5) the number of hours of remediation that the
- 7 student has attended, including[+
- 8 [(A) attendance in a college preparatory course
- 9 required under Section 39.025(b-2), if applicable; or
- 10 $\left[\frac{B}{B}\right]$ attendance in and successful completion of
- 11 a transitional college course in reading or mathematics;
- 12 (6) the student's school attendance rate;
- 13 (7) the student's satisfaction of any of the Texas
- 14 Success Initiative (TSI) college readiness benchmarks prescribed
- 15 by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board;
- 16 (8) the student's successful completion of a dual
- 17 credit course in English, mathematics, science, or social studies;
- 18 (9) the student's successful completion of a high
- 19 school pre-advanced placement, advanced placement, or
- 20 international baccalaureate program course in English,
- 21 mathematics, science, or social studies;
- 22 (10) the student's rating of advanced high on the most
- 23 recent high school administration of the Texas English Language
- 24 Proficiency Assessment System;
- 25 (11) the student's score of 50 or greater on a
- 26 College-Level Examination Program examination;
- 27 (12) the student's score on the ACT, the SAT, or the

- 1 Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery test;
- 2 (13) the student's completion of a sequence of courses
- 3 under a career and technical education program required to attain
- 4 an industry-recognized credential or certificate;
- 5 (14) the student's overall preparedness for
- 6 postsecondary success; and
- 7 (15) any other academic information designated for
- 8 consideration by the board of trustees of the school district.
- 9 (j) Notwithstanding any action taken by an individual
- 10 graduation committee under this section, a school district shall
- 11 administer an $[\frac{\text{end-of-course}}{\text{of assessment instrument }}]$ assessment instrument $\frac{\text{required under}}{\text{of administer}}$
- 12 Section 39.023(c) to any student who fails to perform
- 13 satisfactorily on an [end-of-course] assessment instrument
- 14 required under Section 39.023(c) as provided by Section 39.025(b).
- 15 For purposes of Section 39.053(c)(1), an assessment instrument
- 16 administered as provided by this subsection is considered an
- 17 assessment instrument required for graduation retaken by a student.
- 18 (k) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 19 administer [implement] this section [not later than the 2015-2016
- 20 school year].
- 21 (m) With respect to students that are administered
- 22 end-of-course assessment instruments required by Section
- 23 39.023(c), as that section existed before amendment by _.B. ____
- 24 Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, as provided by
- 25 Sections 39.025(f) and (f-1), English I and English II are
- 26 considered separate subjects for purposes of Subsection (a). This
- 27 subsection expires September 1, 2023.

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- 1 SECTION 10. Sections 29.081(b) and (b-1), Education Code,
- 2 are amended to read as follows:
- 3 (b) Each district shall provide accelerated instruction to
- 4 a student enrolled in the district who has taken an [end-of-course]
- 5 assessment instrument required [administered] under Section
- 6 39.023(c) and has not performed satisfactorily on the assessment
- 7 instrument or who is at risk of dropping out of school.
- 8 (b-1) Each school district shall offer before the next
- 9 scheduled administration of the assessment instrument, without
- 10 cost to the student, additional accelerated instruction to each
- 11 student in any subject in which the student failed to perform
- 12 satisfactorily on an [end-of-course] assessment instrument
- 13 required for graduation.
- 14 SECTION 11. Section 29.087(f), Education Code, is amended
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 (f) A student participating in a program authorized by this
- 17 section, other than a student ordered to participate under
- 18 Subsection (d)(1), must have taken the appropriate [end-of-course]
- 19 assessment instruments specified by Section 39.023(c) before
- 20 entering the program and must take each appropriate [end-of-course]
- 21 assessment instrument administered during the period in which the
- 22 student is enrolled in the program. Except for a student ordered
- 23 to participate under Subsection (d)(1), a student participating in
- 24 the program may not take the high school equivalency examination
- 25 unless the student has taken the assessment instruments required by
- 26 this subsection.
- 27 SECTION 12. Section 29.402(b), Education Code, is amended

- 11 (B) an assessment instrument administered under
- 12 <u>Section 39.023(c)</u> as that section existed before amendment by _.B.
- 13 _____, Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017; or
- 14 (C) an assessment instrument administered under
- 15 Section 39.023(c) as that section existed before amendment by
- 16 Chapter 1312 (S.B. 1031), Acts of the 80th Legislature, Regular
- 17 Session, 2007.
- 18 SECTION 13. Sections 39.023(a-2), (c-1), (c-3), and (e),
- 19 Education Code, as effective September 1, 2017, are amended to read
- 20 as follows:
- 21 (a-2) Except as required by federal law, a student is not
- 22 required to be assessed in a subject otherwise assessed at the
- 23 student's grade level under Subsection (a) if the student[+
- [(1)] is enrolled in a course in the subject intended
- 25 for students above the student's grade level and will be
- 26 administered an assessment instrument adopted or developed under
- 27 Subsection (a) that aligns with the curriculum for the course in

- 1 which the student is enrolled[+ or
- 2 [(2) is enrolled in a course in the subject for which
- 3 the student will receive high school academic credit and will be
- 4 administered an end-of-course assessment instrument adopted under

- 11 (c-3) In adopting a schedule for the administration of
- 12 assessment instruments under this section, the State Board of

- 15 Subsection (a) to be administered on a schedule so that the first
- 16 assessment instrument is administered at least two weeks later than
- 17 the date on which the first assessment instrument was administered

To ensure a valid bank of 4 5 questions for use each year, the agency is not required to release a question that is being field-tested and was not used to compute the 6 student's score on the instrument. The agency shall also release, 7 under board rule, each question that is no 8 field-tested and that was not used to compute a student's score. 9 This subsection applies in the same manner to each end-of-course 10 assessment instrument administered under Subsection (c) [During 11 the 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 school years, the agency shall release 12 the questions and answer keys to assessment instruments as 13 14 described by this subsection each year]. 15 SECTION 14. in this subsection. The agency shall also adopt the Texas Success

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- 1 Initiative (TSI) diagnostic assessment as the assessment instrument to be administered in mathematics and reading at the 2 3 secondary level. The agency shall determine the appropriate grade level, manner, and schedule for the administration of those 4 portions of the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) diagnostic 5 <u>assessment.</u> If a student is in a special education program under 6 Subchapter A, Chapter 29, the student's admission, review, and 7 8 dismissal committee shall determine whether any modification is necessary in administering to the student an 9 10 assessment instrument required under this subsection. The State Board of Education shall administer the end-of-course assessment 11 12 instruments listed in this subsection. The State Board of Education shall adopt a schedule for the administration of the 13 14 end-of-course assessment instruments that complies with the 15 requirements of Subsection (c-3).
- 16 (c-2) The agency may adopt end-of-course assessment
 17 instruments for <u>subjects</u> [courses] not <u>identified</u> [listed] in
 18 Subsection (c). A student's performance on an end-of-course

- (c-5) A student's performance on an [end-of-course]

 included in the student's academic achievement record.
- (h) <u>Subject to any alternative procedures provided by rule</u>
 under this subsection, the [The] agency shall notify school
 districts and campuses of the results of assessment instruments

- 1 administered under this section not later than the 21st day after
- 2 the date the assessment instrument is administered. The agency by
- 3 rule shall adopt procedures to ensure that school districts and
- 4 campuses are notified of the results of the mathematics and reading
- 5 portions of the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) assessment
