A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of a task force to identify opportunities for academic credit and industry recognition for inmates of the 3 Texas Department of Criminal Justice. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 19, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 19.012 to read as follows: 7 Sec. 19.012. TASK FORCE ON ACADEMIC CREDIT AND INDUSTRY 8 RECOGNITION. (a) The Windham School District, in consultation 9 with the department, shall establish a task force to review the work 10 or other productive activities in which persons confined or 11 imprisoned in the department engage. 12 (b) The task force is composed of the following 10 members: 13 14 (1) two representatives of the department designated by the executive <u>director of the department;</u> 15 16 (2) one representative of the district designated by the superintendent of the district; 17 18 (3) one representative of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board designated by the commissioner of higher 19 education; 20 21 (4) one representative of the Texas Workforce 22 Commission designated by the executive director of the commission; 23 (5) one representative of a private vendor operating a correctional facility under a contract with the department, 24

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1	appointed by the governor;
2	(6) three representatives of public junior colleges,
3	as defined by Section 61.003, appointed by the governor, including:
4	(A) at least one representative of a public
5	junior college that provides education services to persons confined
6	or imprisoned in the department; and
7	(B) at least one representative of a public
8	junior college that does not provide services described by
9	Paragraph (A); and
10	(7) one representative of a faith-based organization,
11	appointed by the governor.
12	(c) The governor shall designate a member of the task force
13	to serve as presiding officer.
14	(d) A vacancy on the task force shall be filled in the same
15	manner as the initial appointment.
16	(e) A member of the task force may not receive compensation
17	for service on the task force but is entitled to reimbursement for
18	actual and necessary expenses incurred in performing task force
19	duties.
20	(f) The task force may accept gifts and grants from any
21	source to be used to carry out a function of the task force.
22	(g) The task force shall meet at the call of the presiding

24	(h) The task force shall:
25	(1) conduct an ongoing comprehensive review of the

27	imprisoned in the department engage; and

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1 (2) identify opportunities for the award of high 2 school credit, college credit, or joint high school and college 3 credit, or the award of an industry-recognized credential or 4 certificate, for engaging in that work or activity.

5 <u>(i)</u> The district, in consultation with the department, the 6 Texas Education Agency, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating 7 Board, and the Texas Workforce Commission, shall, for any type of 8 work or productive activity for which an opportunity is identified 9 under Subsection (h), determine the actions necessary for obtaining 10 the award of the applicable academic credit or industry 11 recognition.

(j) Not later than September 1, 2021, the task force shall 12 submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the 13 house of representatives, and the standing committees of the 14 15 legislature having jurisdiction over the department a report that summarizes the review conducted under Subsection (h) and the 16 17 district's actions with regard to obtaining the award of academic credit or industry recognition under Subsection (i). The district 18 19 shall provide the task force with any information necessary to complete the report. 20

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(k) This section expires December 1, 2021.

SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2017, the executive director of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice, the superintendent of the Windham School District, the commissioner of higher education, the executive director of the Texas Workforce Commission, and the governor shall appoint members to the task force established by Section 19.012, Education Code, as added by

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this Act, in the manner required by Subsection (b) of that section.
SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
