Sections 25.112(a), (d), and (e), Education 5 Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 (a) Except as otherwise authorized by this section, a school 7 district may not enroll more than 18 students in a prekindergarten 8 class or 22 students in a kindergarten, first, second, third, or 9 fourth grade class. <u>A limit imposed by this subsection</u> [That 10 11 limitation] does not apply during: 12 (1) any 12-week period of the school year selected by the district, in the case of a district whose average daily 13 14 attendance is adjusted under Section 42.005(c); or 15 (2) the last 12 weeks of any school year in the case of any other district. 16 (d) On application of a school district, the commissioner 17 may except the district from a [the] limit imposed by [in] 18 Subsection (a) if the commissioner finds the limit works an undue 19 20 hardship on the district. An exception expires at the end of the 21 school year for which it is granted. 22 (e) A school district seeking an exception under Subsection 23 (d) shall notify the commissioner and apply for the exception not later than the later of: 24

2 (2) the 30th day after the first school day the
3 district exceeds <u>a</u> [the] limit <u>imposed by</u> [in] Subsection (a).

4 SECTION 2. Section 25.113(a), Education Code, is amended to 5 read as follows:

6 (a) A campus or district that is granted an exception under 7 Section 25.112(d) from class size limits shall provide written 8 notice of the exception to the parent of or person standing in 9 parental relation to each student affected by the exception. The 10 notice must be in conspicuous bold or underlined print and:

(1) specify the class for which an exception from <u>a</u>
[the] limit imposed by Section 25.112(a) was granted;

13 (2) state the number of children in the class for which14 the exception was granted; and

15 (3) be included in a regular mailing or other 16 communication from the campus or district, such as information sent 17 home with students.

SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022 school year.

20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect August 1, 2021.
