A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the composition of the Texas Historical Commission. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Δ SECTION 1. Section 442.002(b), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 5 6 (b) The commission is composed of 15 [nine] members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate. 7 8 One member must have expertise in archeology, preferably as a professional archeologist, one must have expertise in history, 9 10 preferably as a professional historian, and one must have expertise in architecture, preferably as a professional architect who is 11 12 licensed in this state and has expertise in historic preservation and architectural history. The remaining members must represent 13 the general public. A person is [may] not eligible for appointment 14 15 as [be] a member of the commission if the person or the person's 16 spouse:

(1) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other organization regulated by the commission or receiving money other than grant money from the commission;

(2) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible
goods, services, or money from the commission, other than
compensation or reimbursement authorized by law for commission
membership, attendance, or expenses; or

1 (3) is employed by or participates in the management 2 of a business entity or other organization regulated by or 3 receiving money other than grant money from the commission.

4 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 5 of this Act, the governor shall appoint six additional members to 6 the Texas Historical Commission as required by Section 442.002(b), 7 Government Code, as amended by this Act. In appointing the 8 additional members to the commission, the governor shall appoint:

9 (1) two members, including one member with archeology 10 expertise, to terms expiring February 1, 2019;

11 (2) two members, including one member with history 12 expertise, to terms expiring February 1, 2021; and

13 (3) two members, including one member with14 architecture expertise, to terms expiring February 1, 2023.

15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
