## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority of a code enforcement officer when
3	performing official duties to possess or carry an instrument used
4	for deterring the bite of an animal.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 46.15, Penal Code, is amended by adding
7	Subsection (h) to read as follows:
8	(h) The provisions of Sections 46.02 and 46.03 prohibiting
9	the possession or carrying of a club do not apply to a code
10	enforcement officer who:
11	(1) holds a certificate of registration issued under
12	Chapter 1952, Occupations Code; and
13	(2) possesses or carries an instrument used
14	specifically for deterring the bite of an animal while the officer
15	<u>is:</u>
16	(A) performing official duties; or
17	(B) traveling to or from a place of duty.
18	SECTION 2. Section 1952.051, Occupations Code, as effective
19	September 1, 2017, is amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as
20	follows:
21	(c) The education requirements adopted under Subsection (b)
22	must include education regarding the principles and procedures to
23	be followed when possessing or carrying an instrument used
24	specifically for deterring the bite of an animal.

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SECTION 3. Section 1952.1051, Occupations Code, as
effective September 1, 2017, is amended to read as follows:
Sec. 1952.1051. CONTINUING EDUCATION. The commission by

4 rule shall prescribe continuing education requirements for code 5 enforcement officers and code enforcement officers in training 6 that:

7 (1) establish the number of hours of continuing8 education required for renewal of a certificate of registration;

9 (2) establish an approved curriculum that includes 10 material regarding changes in applicable law <u>and the principles and</u> 11 <u>procedures to be followed when possessing or carrying an instrument</u>

12 used specifically for deterring the bite of an animal; and

13 (3) provide that the approved curriculum may be taught 14 by suitable public agencies and by private entities approved by the 15 department.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
