5 SECTION 2. Section 42.0421(a), Human Resources Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:

7 (a) The minimum training standards prescribed by the 8 executive commissioner under Section 42.042(p) for an employee, 9 director, or operator of a day-care center, group day-care home, or 10 registered family home must include:

11 (1) 24 hours of initial training that must be completed not later than the 90th day after the employee's first day 12 of employment for an employee of a day-care center who has no 13 14 previous training or less than two years of employment experience 15 in a regulated child-care facility, eight hours of which must be completed before the employee is given responsibility for a group 16 17 of children;

18 (2) 24 hours of annual training for each employee of a 19 day-care center or group day-care home, excluding the director, 20 which must include at least six hours of training in one or more of 21 the following areas:

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30 hours of annual training for each director of a 1 (3) day-care center or group day-care home, or operator of a registered 2 3 family home, which must include at least six hours of training in one or more of the following areas: 4 5 (A) child growth and development; (B) guidance and discipline; 6 7 (C) age-appropriate curriculum; [and] 8 (D) teacher-child interaction; and 9 (E) child nutrition and age-appropriate indoor 10 and outdoor activities. SECTION 3. Section 2308.3155(b), Government Code, 11 is amended to read as follows: 12 The commission shall adopt rules to administer the Texas 13 (b) 14 Rising Star Program, including: 15 (1) guidelines for rating a child-care provider who provides child care to a child younger than 13 years of age, 16 17 including infants and toddlers, enrolled in the subsidized program; [and] 18 19 (2) guidelines for rating a child-care provider on: 20 (A) nutrition, lunch provision, and menu planning; and 21 (B) indoor and outdoor activities; 22 (3) a scoring methodology that credits a provider for 23 24 participating in, and remaining in good standing with, the Child and Adult Care Food Program administered by the Texas Department of 25 26 Agriculture; and 27 (4) a timeline and process for regularly reviewing and

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1 updating the quality standards used to determine the rating system
2 that includes the commission's consideration of input from
3 interested parties regarding those standards.

4 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date 5 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human 6 Services Commission and the Texas Workforce Commission shall adopt 7 the rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by this 8 Act.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
