- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28.025(b-2), Education Code, as amended
- 6 by Chapters 211 (H.B. 5) and 214 (H.B. 2201), Acts of the 83rd
- 7 Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, is reenacted and amended to

- 9 (b-2) In adopting rules under Subsection (b-1), the State
- 10 Board of Education shall:
- 11 (1) provide for a student to comply with the

- 14 I, English II, and English III], for an advanced mathematics course

- 4 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018

- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
