7 SECTION 11. (a) Not later than September 1, 2018, the Texas 8 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt rules to 9 implement the changes in law made by this Act to Chapter 1602, 10 Occupations Code.

The changes in law made by this Act apply only to an 11 (b) application for the issuance or renewal of a license or certificate 12 that is filed with the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation 13 on or after September 1, 2018. An application for the issuance or 14 15 renewal of a license or certificate that is filed before that date is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective 16 17 date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 18

SECTION 12. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of thissection, this Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

(b) Section 1602.408, Occupations Code, as added by thisAct, takes effect September 1, 2018.
