- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 112, Transportation Code, is amended by 6 adding Subchapter E to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER E. SECURITY FOR HIGH-SPEED RAIL OPERATED BY PRIVATE
- 8 ENTITY
- 9 Sec. 112.201. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "high-speed
- 10 rail" means intercity passenger rail service that is reasonably
- 11 expected to reach speeds of at least 110 miles per hour.
- 12 Sec. 112.202. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies only
- 13 to high-speed rail operated by a private entity.
- 14 Sec. 112.203. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY POWERS AND
- 15 DUTIES. (a) To the extent not preempted by federal law, the
- 16 Department of Public Safety:
- 17 (1) shall administer and enforce the provisions of
- 18 this subchapter; and
- (2) may adopt rules as necessary to administer this
- 20 <u>subchapter</u>.

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- 21 (b) In carrying out the powers and duties under this
- 22 subchapter, the Department of Public Safety has the same authority
- 23 granted to the Texas Department of Transportation under Subchapter
- 24 B, Chapter 111.

- 1 (c) The Department of Public Safety shall provide the
- 2 emergency management training course described by Section 418.005,
- 3 Government Code, to employees of a high-speed rail line designated
- 4 under Section 112.204(c).
- 5 Sec. 112.204. SECURITY. (a) A high-speed rail operator
- 6 shall, in the manner required by law for Amtrak, as defined by 49
- 7 <u>U.S.C.</u> Section 24301, including by implementing any measures
- 8 required by regulations or guidelines adopted for Amtrak by the
- 9 Transportation Security Administration or a successor agency:
- 10 (1) establish secured areas;
- 11 (2) operate security screening stations; and
- 12 (3) provide on-board security for the entire rail
- 13 line.
- 14 (b) A high-speed rail operator shall collect and
- 15 investigate security threat reports submitted by members of the
- 16 public.
- 17 <u>(c) A high-speed rail operator shall:</u>
- 18 (1) designate employees who are managers or
- 19 supervisors and whose position description, job duties, or
- 20 assignment includes emergency management responsibilities; and
- 21 (2) require those employees to complete the emergency
- 22 management training described by Section 418.005, Government Code.
- 23 (d) A high-speed rail operator may not use the services of a
- 24 peace officer employed by this state or a political subdivision of
- 25 this state unless the operator compensates the state or political
- 26 subdivision, as applicable, for the officer's time.
- 27 Sec. 112.205. COORDINATION WITH OTHER ENTITIES. (a) A

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- 1 high-speed rail operator shall coordinate security activities and
- 2 investigations with local law enforcement agencies, including by
- 3 communicating about credible threats, major events, and vulnerable
- 4 places along the rail line or on a train.
- 5 (b) A high-speed rail operator shall communicate as
- 6 appropriate with the state Emergency Management Council and the
- 7 Texas Division of Emergency Management about security issues.
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
