- 2 relating to medical causation narrative reports created under the
- 3 Texas Workers' Compensation Act.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 408, Labor Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 408.0273 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 408.0273. MEDICAL CAUSATION NARRATIVE REPORT. (a) In
- 8 this section, "medical causation narrative report" means an
- 9 original report created by a doctor that explains a causal
- 10 connection between a workplace accident and a diagnosed injury.
- 11 (b) If an insurance carrier disputes the extent of an
- 12 employee's compensable injury or if an injured employee does not
- 13 agree with the opinion of a designated doctor under Section
- 14 408.0041 on that issue, the insurance carrier shall reimburse the
- 15 treating doctor or doctor to whom the injured employee is referred
- 16 by the treating doctor for the creation of a medical causation
- 17 narrative report addressing that issue, regardless of whether the
- 18 injured employee, a representative of the injured employee, or the
- 19 <u>insurance carrier requests the creation of the report.</u>
- 20 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a
- 21 medical causation narrative report requested on or after the
- 22 effective date of this Act, regardless of whether the compensable
- 23 injury occurred before, on, or after that date.
- 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
