S.B. No. 1039

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

1  
2 relating to the filing requirements for certain documents in mental  
3 health cases.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 571.014(c), Health and Safety Code, is  
6 amended to read as follows:

7 (c) A person may [~~initially~~] file a paper with the county  
8 clerk by the use of reproduced, photocopied, or electronically  
9 transmitted paper [~~if the person files the original signed copies~~  
10 ~~of the paper with the clerk not later than the 72nd hour after the~~  
11 ~~hour on which the initial filing is made. If the 72-hour period~~  
12 ~~ends on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the filing period is~~  
13 ~~extended until 4 p.m. on the first succeeding business day. If~~  
14 ~~extremely hazardous weather conditions exist or a disaster occurs,~~  
15 ~~the presiding judge or magistrate may by written order made each day~~  
16 ~~extend the filing period until 4 p.m. on the first succeeding~~  
17 ~~business day. The written order must declare that an emergency~~  
18 ~~exists because of the weather or the occurrence of a disaster. If a~~  
19 ~~person detained under this subtitle would otherwise be released~~  
20 ~~because the original signed copy of a paper is not filed within the~~  
21 ~~72-hour period but for the extension of the filing period under this~~  
22 ~~section, the person may be detained until the expiration of the~~  
23 ~~extended filing period. This subsection does not affect another~~  
24 ~~provision of this subtitle requiring the release or discharge of a~~

1 ~~person~~]. If the paper is filed with the county clerk by the use of  
2 reproduced, photocopied, or electronically transmitted paper, the  
3 person filing the paper shall:

4 (1) maintain the original signed copies of the paper;  
5 and

6 (2) on request of a party or the court, file the  
7 original signed copies of the paper with the clerk.

8 SECTION 2. Section 571.014(d), Health and Safety Code, is  
9 repealed.

10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
