AN ACT

- 2 relating to cosmetology licensing and sanitation requirements.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 1602.254, Occupations Code, is amended
- 5 by adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
- 6 (b-1) A requirement under Subsection (b)(3) may be
- 7 fulfilled, in whole or in part, by academic credit hours. The
- 8 attribution of academic credit hours must be made in accordance
- 9 with a formula, adopted by commission rule, that the commission
- 10 determines fairly equates academic credit hours with clock hours of
- 11 instruction.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 1603.102, Occupations Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 1603.102. SANITATION RULES. (a) The commission shall
- 15 establish sanitation rules to prevent the spread of an infectious
- 16 or contagious disease.
- (b) Rules adopted under this section applicable to an
- 18 individual or facility regulated under Chapter 1602 shall be
- 19 consistent with the standards and terminology related to safety and
- 20 sanitation that are commonly used in the cosmetology industry.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 1603.256(c), Occupations Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (c) The following persons may administer a practical
- 24 examination required under this subchapter:

- 1 (1) the department; [or]
- 2 (2) a person with whom the department contracts under
- 3 Section 1603.252; or
- 4 (3) a private beauty culture school or a vocational
- 5 cosmetology program in a public school licensed under this chapter
- 6 <u>or Chapter 1602</u>.
- 7 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 8 1603.256(c), Occupations Code, applies to an examination
- 9 administered on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 10 examination administered before the effective date of this Act is
- 11 governed by the law in effect on the date the examination was
- 12 administered, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
