- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 124.001, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 124.001. DETENTION. (a) A person who reasonably
- 9 believes that another has stolen or is attempting to steal property
- 10 is privileged to detain that person in a reasonable manner and for a
- 11 reasonable time to investigate ownership of the property.
- (b) A person who is in the business of selling goods or
- 13 <u>services as a merchant is not precluded from:</u>
- 14 (1) offering a person who is suspected of stealing or
- 15 attempting to steal property from the merchant an opportunity to
- 16 complete the merchant's education program instead of reporting the
- 17 suspected offense to a law enforcement agency;
- 18 (2) informing the other person of the civil and
- 19 criminal remedies available to the merchant and the state; and
- 20 (3) reducing or waiving a fee for the education
- 21 program based on the other person's ability to pay.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
