A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the protection of expressive activities at public
3	institutions of higher education.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 51.9315 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 51.9315. PROTECTED EXPRESSION ON CAMPUS. (a) In this
8	section:
9	(1) "Expressive activities" means any speech or
10	expressive conduct protected by the First Amendment to the United
11	States Constitution or Section 8, Article I, Texas Constitution,
12	and includes assemblies, protests, speeches, the distribution of
13	written material, the carrying of signs, and the circulation of
14	petitions.
15	(2) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
16	assigned by Section 61.003.
17	(b) An institution of higher education may not designate any
18	area on campus as a free speech zone or otherwise create policies
19	implying that its students' expressive activities are restricted to
20	particular areas of campus. An institution of higher education may
21	not, except to provide time, place, or manner restrictions as
22	provided by Subsection (c), restrict the right of students to
23	engage in expression in a student forum.
24	(c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), an institution of

higher education by rule may maintain and enforce reasonable 1 restrictions on the time, place, and manner of expressive 2 3 activities on the common outdoor areas of the institution's campus 4 if those restrictions: 5 (1) are narrowly tailored to serve a significant 6 institutional interest; 7 (2) employ clear, published, content-neutral, and viewpoint-neutral criteria; and 8 9 (3) provide for ample alternative means of expression. Each institution of higher education shall adopt a 10 (d) policy detailing students' and employees' rights to engage in 11 expressive activities at the institution. The policy must: 12 (1) prohibit: 13 (A) reducing a student's grade for engaging in 14 15 expressive activities; and (B) increasing a student's grade for engaging in 16 17 expressive activities, unless a variety of expressive activities and viewpoints, including the viewpoints of any political party, 18 qualify for the increase; 19 (2) include a grievance procedure for addressing 20 complaints of a violation of this section; 21 22 (3) be approved by a majority vote of the institution's governing board <u>before final adoption; and</u> 23 (4) be posted on the institution's Internet website. 24 25 (e) Each institution of higher education shall inform students enrolled at and employees of the institution of the policy 26 27 adopted under Subsection (d), including by:

1	(1) discussing the policy during student orientation;
2	and
3	(2) annually distributing a copy of the policy to
4	students and employees.
5	(f) An institution of higher education or any employee of
6	the institution may not punish a student or employee in any manner
7	for engaging in expressive activities.
8	SECTION 2. If any provision of this Act or its application

9 to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does 10 not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be 11 given effect without the invalid provision or application, and the 12 provisions of this Act are severable for this purpose.

13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
