BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 51.9315 to read as follows:

Sec. 51.9315. PROTECTED EXPRESSION ON CAMPUS. (a) In this section:

- "Expressive <u>acti</u>vities" (1)means speech any expressive conduct protected by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution or Section 8, Article I, Texas Constitution, and includes assemblies, protests, speeches, the distribution of written material, the carrying of signs, and the circulation of petitions.
- "Institution of higher education" has the meaning (2) assigned by Section 61.003.
- (b) Each institution of higher education shall adopt a policy detailing students' and employees' rights to engage in expressive activities at the institution. The policy must:

 (1) prohibit:

- (A) reducing a student's grade for engaging in expressive activities; and
- (B) increasing a student's grade for engaging in expressive activities, unless a variety of expressive activities and viewpoints, including the viewpoints of any political party, qualify for the increase;
- (2) include a grievance procedure for addressing complaints of a violation of this section;
- (3) be approved by a majority vote of the institution's governing board before final adoption; and

(4) be posted on the institution's Internet website.

- Each institution of higher education shall inform students enrolled at and employees of the institution of the policy
- adopted under Subsection (b), including by:
 (1) discussing the policy during student orientation;

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- (2) annually distributing a copy of the policy to students and employees. 1-55
- (d) An institution of higher education or any employee of 1-56 1-57 institution may not punish a student or employee in any manner for engaging in expressive activities. 1-58
- 1-59 SECTION 2. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does 1-60

C.S.S.B. No. 1151 not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and the provisions of this Act are severable for this purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017. 2-1

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
