## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to authorization by the Texas Higher Education
- 3 Coordinating Board for certain public junior colleges to offer
- 4 baccalaureate degree programs.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 130.0012, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsections (a), (b), and (e) and adding Subsections
- 8 (b-4), (b-5), (b-6), and (g-1) to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may
- 10 [shall] authorize public junior colleges to offer baccalaureate
- 11 degree programs in the fields of applied science, [and] applied
- 12 technology, and nursing under this section. Offering a
- 13 baccalaureate degree program under this section does not otherwise
- 14 alter the role and mission of a public junior college.
- 15 (b) The coordinating board:
- 16 (1) shall authorize baccalaureate degree programs at
- 17 each public junior college that previously participated in a pilot
- 18 project to offer baccalaureate degree programs; and
- 19 (2) may authorize baccalaureate degree programs at one
- 20 or more public junior colleges that offer a degree program in the
- 21 field of nursing and have demonstrated a workforce need.
- 22 (b-4) The coordinating board shall establish a pilot
- 23 project to examine the feasibility and effectiveness of authorizing
- 24 not more than two baccalaureate degree programs, one in the field of

- 1 applied science or applied technology, and one in the field of
- 2 nursing at a public junior college with a main campus located on a
- 3 barrier island and at a public junior college with not more than
- 4 three main campuses located in a county with a population greater
- 5 than 3.3 million.
- 6 (b-5) Not later than January 1, 2019, the coordinating board
- 7 shall prepare a progress report on the pilot project established
- 8 under Subsection (b-4). Not later than January 1, 2021, the
- 9 coordinating board shall prepare a report on the effectiveness of
- 10 the pilot project, including any recommendations for legislative
- 11 action regarding the offering of baccalaureate degree programs in
- 12 the fields of applied science, applied technology, and nursing by a
- 13 public junior college. The coordinating board shall deliver a copy
- 14 of each report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the
- 15 speaker of the house of representatives, and the chair of the
- 16 standing committee of each house of the legislature with primary
- 17 jurisdiction over higher education. Unless the authority to
- 18 continue offering a baccalaureate degree program in the fields of
- 19 applied science, applied technology, and nursing is continued by
- 20 the legislature, a public junior college may not:
- 21 (1) enroll a new student in a baccalaureate degree
- 22 program under the pilot project after the 2022 fall semester;
- 23 (2) offer junior-level or senior-level courses for
- 24 those degree programs after the 2025 fall semester, unless the
- 25 coordinating board authorizes the college to offer those courses;
- 26 or
- 27 (3) award a baccalaureate degree under the pilot

- 1 project after the 2025 fall semester, unless the coordinating board
- 2 approves the awarding of the degree.
- 3 (b-6) This subsection and Subsections (b-4) and (b-5)
- 4 expire on the first December 31 following the first regular
- 5 legislative session that occurs after the sixth anniversary of the
- 6 date a public junior college offering a degree program in the fields
- 7 of applied science, applied technology, and nursing under
- 8 Subsection (b-4) meets the accreditation requirements of
- 9 Subsection (c).
- 10 (e) In determining what baccalaureate degree programs are
- 11 to be offered, the coordinating board shall consider the following
- 12 factors:
- 13 (1) the workforce need for the degree programs in the
- 14 region served by the junior college;
- 15 (2) how those degree programs would complement the
- 16 other programs and course offerings of the junior college and
- 17 whether the associate degree program offered by the junior college
- 18 in the same field has been successful;
- 19 (3) whether those degree programs would unnecessarily
- 20 duplicate the degree programs offered by other institutions of
- 21 higher education or whether a partnership with other institutions
- 22 of higher education is possible; [and]
- 23 (4) the ability of the junior college to support the
- 24 program with student enrollment and the adequacy of the junior
- 25 college's facilities, faculty, administration, libraries, and
- 26 other resources; and
- 27 (5) whether the junior college meets the taxable

- 1 property valuation amount established in Section 130.032.
- 2 (g-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (g), a degree program
- 3 <u>established under Subsection (b-4) may be funded solely by a public</u>
- 4 junior college's proportionate share of state appropriations under
- 5 Section 130.003, local funds, and private sources. This subsection
- 6 expires January 1, 2022.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
