A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the investment of a portion of the economic stabilization fund balance. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Sections 404.0241(a) and (b), Government Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) The comptroller shall invest the balance [a percentage] of the economic stabilization fund [balance in a state fiscal 8 9 biennium] that exceeds an [the] amount equal to 30 percent of the maximum authorized [of the sufficient] balance of the fund for the 10 applicable state fiscal biennium as prescribed by Section 49-g(g), 11 Article III, Texas Constitution, [adopted under Section 316.092 for 12 that biennium] in accordance with the investment standard described 13 by Section 404.024(j). The comptroller's investment of that 14 [percentage of the] excess balance is not subject to any other 15 16 limitation or other requirement provided by Section 404.024. (b) The comptroller shall adjust the investment portfolio 17 of economic stabilization fund money periodically to ensure that, 18 as appropriated money is withdrawn or money is otherwise 19 transferred from the fund or as the maximum authorized balance of 20 the fund as prescribed by Section 49-g(g), Article III, Texas 21 Constitution, changes, only the balance of the fund that exceeds 22 23 the amount specified by Subsection (a) is invested in a manner that does not comply with all limitations and other requirements of 24

1 Section 404.024 [is sufficient to meet the cash flow requirements
2 of the fund].

3 SECTION 2. Section 404.0241 (d), Government Code is 4 repealed.

5 SECTION 3. The comptroller of public accounts shall adjust 6 the investment portfolio of economic stabilization fund money as 7 soon as possible after the effective date of this Act to ensure that 8 the investment of that money complies with Section 404.0241, 9 Government Code, as amended by this Act.
