## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to eligibility requirements for the repayment of certain
3	physician education loans.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Sections 61.532(a) and (b), Education Code, are
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(a) To be eligible to receive repayment assistance, a
8	physician must:
9	(1) apply to the coordinating board;
10	(2) at the time of application, be licensed to
11	practice medicine under Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code;
12	(3) have completed one, two, three, or four
13	consecutive years of practice:
14	(A) in a health professional shortage area
15	designated by the Department of State Health Services; [ex]
16	(B) <u>in:</u>
17	(i) a state supported living center, as
18	defined by Section 531.002, Health and Safety Code; or
19	(ii) a state hospital, as defined by
20	Section 552.0011, Health and Safety Code; or
21	(C) in accordance with Subsection (b), after
22	funds have been fully allocated for the program year to physicians
23	qualifying under Paragraph (A) or (B); and

(4) unless the physician qualifies under Subsection

- 1  $\underline{(a)(3)(B)}$ , provide health care services to:
- 2 (A) recipients under the medical assistance
- 3 program authorized by Chapter 32, Human Resources Code;
- 4 (B) enrollees under the child health plan program
- 5 authorized by Chapter 62, Health and Safety Code; or
- 6 (C) persons committed to a secure correctional
- 7 facility operated by or under contract with the Texas Juvenile
- 8 Justice Department or persons confined in a secure correctional
- 9 facility operated by or under contract with any division of the
- 10 Texas Department of Criminal Justice.
- 11 (b) A physician may complete one or more years of practice
- 12 required by Subsection (a)(3)(C)  $[\frac{(a)(3)}{(a)}]$  in a location other than
- 13 an area or facility described by Subsection (a)(3)(A) or (B)  $\left[\frac{a}{a}\right]$
- 14 health professional shortage area designated by the Department of
- 15 State Health Services] if, during the applicable year or years, the
- 16 physician provides health care services to a designated number of
- 17 patients who are recipients under the medical assistance program
- 18 authorized by Chapter 32, Human Resources Code, or the Texas
- 19 Women's Health Program according to criteria established by the
- 20 board in consultation with the Health and Human Services
- 21 Commission. The Health and Human Services Commission shall verify
- 22 a physician's compliance with this subsection, and the board and
- 23 the commission shall enter into a memorandum of understanding for
- 24 that purpose.
- 25 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 26 61.532, Education Code, applies only to eligibility for loan
- 27 repayment assistance under Subchapter J, Chapter 61, Education

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- 1 Code, on the basis of an application submitted on or after September
- 2 1, 2017. Eligibility on the basis of an application submitted
- 3 before September 1, 2017, is covered by the law in effect at the
- 4 time the application was submitted, and the former law is continued
- 5 in effect for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
