## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to psychological counseling for certain grand jurors.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

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4 SECTION 1. Article 56.04(f), Code of Criminal Procedure, is 5 amended to read as follows:

- 6 The commissioners court may approve a program in which the crime victim liaison or victim assistance coordinator may offer 7 8 not more than 10 hours of <u>post-investigation or</u> posttrial psychological counseling for a person who serves as a grand juror, 9 10 alternate grand juror, juror, or [an] alternate juror in a grand jury investigation or criminal trial involving graphic evidence or 11 12 testimony and who requests the post-investigation or posttrial psychological counseling not later than the 180th day after the 13 date on which the grand jury or jury [in the trial] is dismissed. 14 The crime victim liaison or victim assistance coordinator may 15 provide the counseling using a provider that assists local criminal 16
- SECTION 2. Section 61.003(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

justice agencies in providing similar services to victims.

20 (a) Each person who reports for jury service shall be 21 personally provided a form letter that when signed by the person 22 directs the county treasurer to donate all, or a specific amount 23 designated by the person, of the person's daily reimbursement under 24 this chapter to:

- 1 (1) the compensation to victims of crime fund under
- 2 Subchapter B, Chapter 56, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 3 (2) the child welfare, child protective services, or
- 4 child services board of the county appointed under Section 264.005,
- 5 Family Code, that serves abused and neglected children;
- 6 (3) any program selected by the commissioners court
- 7 that is operated by a public or private nonprofit organization and
- 8 that provides shelter and services to victims of family violence;
- 9 (4) any other program approved by the commissioners
- 10 court of the county, including a program established under Article
- 11 56.04(f), Code of Criminal Procedure, that offers psychological
- 12 counseling [to jurors] in criminal cases involving graphic evidence
- 13 or testimony; or
- 14 (5) a veterans court program established by the
- 15 commissioners court as provided by Chapter 124.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
