A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to psychological counseling for certain grand jurors.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Article 56.04(f), Code of Criminal Procedure, is 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (f) The commissioners court may approve a program in which
- 7 the crime victim liaison or victim assistance coordinator may offer
- 8 not more than 10 hours of $\underline{\text{post-investigation}}$ or $\underline{\text{post-investigation}}$ or
- 9 psychological counseling for a person who serves as a grand juror,
- 10 <u>alternate grand juror,</u> juror<u>,</u> or [an] alternate juror in a <u>grand</u>
- 11 jury investigation or criminal trial involving graphic evidence or
- 12 testimony and who requests the <u>post-investigation or</u> posttrial
- 13 psychological counseling not later than the 180th day after the
- 14 date on which the grand jury or jury [in the trial] is
- 15 dismissed. The crime victim liaison or victim assistance
- 16 coordinator may provide the counseling using a provider that
- 17 assists local criminal justice agencies in providing similar
- 18 services to victims.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 61.003(a), Government Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- 21 (a) Each person who reports for jury service shall be
- 22 personally provided a form letter that when signed by the person
- 23 directs the county treasurer to donate all, or a specific amount
- 24 designated by the person, of the person's daily reimbursement under

- 1 this chapter to:
- 2 (1) the compensation to victims of crime fund under
- 3 Subchapter B, Chapter 56, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 4 (2) the child welfare, child protective services, or
- 5 child services board of the county appointed under Section 264.005,
- 6 Family Code, that serves abused and neglected children;
- 7 (3) any program selected by the commissioners court
- 8 that is operated by a public or private nonprofit organization and
- 9 that provides shelter and services to victims of family violence;
- 10 (4) any other program approved by the commissioners
- 11 court of the county, including a program established under Article
- 12 56.04(f), Code of Criminal Procedure, that offers psychological
- 13 counseling [to jurors] in criminal cases involving graphic evidence
- 14 or testimony; or
- 15 (5) a veterans court program established by the
- 16 commissioners court as provided by Chapter 124.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
