A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the taxing power of the North Plains Groundwater3 Conservation District.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 2, Chapter 498, Acts of the 54th 6 Legislature, Regular Session, 1955, is amended to read as follows:

7 Sec. 2. North Plains Groundwater Conservation District, hereinafter sometimes referred to as the District, shall have and 8 exercise and is hereby vested with all of the rights, powers, 9 10 privileges and duties conferred and imposed by the general laws of this State now enforced or hereafter enacted applicable to 11 12 groundwater conservation districts created under authority of 13 Article XVI, Section 59 of the Constitution of Texas, and Chapter 36, Water Code, to: 14

15 (1) formulate, promulgate and enforce rules and 16 regulations for the purpose of conserving, preserving, protecting 17 and recharging the water of any groundwater reservoir or 18 subdivision of a groundwater reservoir in the district;

(2) formulate, promulgate and enforce rules and
regulations to prevent the waste, as defined in Chapter 36, Water
Code, of the underground water of any groundwater reservoir or
subdivision of a groundwater reservoir in the district;

(3) require permits for the drilling, equipping andcompletion of wells in any groundwater reservoir of a groundwater

1 reservoir in the district and to issue such permits subject to such 2 terms and provisions with reference to the drilling, equipping and 3 completion thereof as may be necessary to prevent waste or 4 contamination;

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5 provide for the spacing of wells producing from (4) any groundwater reservoir or subdivision of a groundwater reservoir 6 7 in the district and to regulate the production therefrom so as to minimize as far as practicable the drawdown of the water table or 8 9 the reduction of the artesian pressure; provided, however, the 10 owner of the land, his heirs, assigns and lessees, shall not be 11 denied a permit to drill a well on his land and produce groundwater therefrom subject to rules and regulations promulgated hereunder to 12 13 prevent waste or contamination;

14 (5) require records to be kept and reports to be made 15 of the drilling, equipping, and completion of wells into the 16 reservoirs or subdivisions of groundwater reservoirs and the taking 17 and use of groundwater therefrom; to require accurate drillers' 18 logs to be kept of such wells and a copy thereof and of any electric 19 logs which may be made of such wells to be filed with the district;

(6) acquire lands for the erection of dams and for the purpose of draining lakes, draws, and depressions, and to construct dams, drain lakes, depressions, draws, and creeks and to install pumps and other equipment necessary to recharge any groundwater reservoir or subdivision of a groundwater reservoir in the district;

26 (7) cause to be made by a registered professional27 engineer or qualified groundwater scientist surveys of the

underground water of all groundwater reservoirs or subdivisions of 1 2 groundwater reservoirs in the district and of the facilities for the development, production and use of such water, to determine the 3 4 quantity thereof available for production and use and the improvements, developments, and recharges 5 needed for such groundwater reservoirs or subdivisions of groundwater reservoirs 6 7 in the district;

(8) develop comprehensive plans for the most efficient 8 9 use of the water of the groundwater reservoirs or subdivisions of groundwater reservoirs in the district and for the control and 10 11 prevention of waste of such groundwater, which plans shall specify 12 in such detail as may be practicable the acts, procedure, 13 performance and avoidance which are or may be necessary to effect 14 such plans, including specifications therefor; to carry out research projects, develop information and determine limitations, 15 16 if any, which should be made on the withdrawal of water from the groundwater reservoirs or subdivisions of groundwater reservoirs 17 in the district; to collect and preserve information regarding the 18 use of such water and the practicability of recharge of the 19 20 groundwater reservoirs or subdivisions of groundwater reservoirs 21 in the district; to publish such plans and information, bring them 22 to the notice and attention of the users of such groundwater within the district, and to encourage their adoption and execution; 23

(9) enforce, by injunction, mandatory injunction or
other appropriate remedy, in courts of competent jurisdiction,
rules and regulations duly adopted and promulgated by such
district; provided, that no rule or regulation shall be effective

1 until a brief resume thereof has been published once a week for two
2 (2) consecutive weeks in one or more newspapers to give circulation
3 within the district, and such rule or regulation is to be effective
4 not less than fourteen (14) days after the date of the first
5 publication;

6 (10)incur all such indebtedness as may be necessary 7 and requisite to the achievement of the purposes for which the district is created; to issue negotiable bonds and notes in the name 8 9 of the district for any lawful purpose of the district and levy and 10 collect such ad valorem taxes as may be necessary for the payment of 11 the interest and the creation of a sinking fund for the payment of such bonds, the issuance of such bonds and the levy and collection 12 13 of taxes to be in accordance with Chapter 36, Water Code; to levy and collect the ad valorem tax authorized at the election held 14 15 January 21, 1955, for the maintenance of such district, its 16 installations and activities; to hereafter order elections for the purpose of authorizing the levy and collection of taxes for the 17 maintenance of the district, its installations and activities, such 18 elections to be ordered and held as is provided for elections 19 20 authorizing the issuance of bonds; provided that in all bond 21 elections and tax elections all persons may vote who are resident voters of such district; [provided further that the maintenance and 22 operating taxes may never in any one year exceed Five Cents (5¢) on 23 the One Hundred Dollar (\$100) assessed valuation on property in the 24 25 district subject to taxation;] and provided, further, that the district may have its taxes assessed and collected by the 26 27 respective county tax assessors and collectors as provided in

legal notice of the SECTION 2. (a) The intention 3 to 4 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a 5 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, 6 7 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313, 8 9 Government Code.

10 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has 11 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on 12 Environmental Quality.

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed 13 (c) its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the 14 15 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of 16 representatives within the required time.

17 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this 18 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect 19 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled 20 and accomplished.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
