A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the minimum amount of student instruction required to be provided by school districts. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 25.081, Education Code, is amended by 5 amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), and (e) and adding Subsection 6 7 (a-1) to read as follows: (a) Except as authorized under Subsection (b) of this 8 9 section, Section 25.084, or Section 29.0821, for each school year 10 each school district must operate so that the district provides for at least, at the choice of the district: 11 12 (1) 75,600 minutes of instruction, including intermissions and recesses, for students; or 13 14 (2) 180 days of instruction for students. (a-1) Not later than May 1 of each year, each school 15 16 district shall notify the commissioner whether the district will comply with Subsection (a) on the basis of minutes of instruction or 17 days of instruction. The commissioner may adopt rules as necessary 18 to administer this subsection. 19 20 The commissioner may approve the instruction (b) of students for fewer than the number of minutes or days required under 21 Subsection (a) if disaster, flood, extreme weather conditions, fuel 22 23 curtailment, or another calamity causes the closing of schools. (c) If the commissioner does not approve 24 reduced

1 instruction time under Subsection (b), a school district may add 2 additional minutes to the end of the district's normal school hours 3 <u>or additional days to the district's normal school calendar</u> as 4 necessary to compensate for minutes <u>or days</u> of instruction lost due 5 to school closures caused by disaster, flood, extreme weather 6 conditions, fuel curtailment, or another calamity.

7 (e) For purposes of this code, a reference to a day of 8 instruction means <u>a calendar day in which a student is scheduled for</u> 9 <u>and receives at least the minimum number of instructional hours</u> 10 <u>required for the student to be considered full-time for the purpose</u> 11 <u>of calculating average daily attendance under Section 42.005</u> [420 12 <u>minutes of instruction</u>].

13 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018 14 school year.

15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
