- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 542.2035, Transportation
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 542.2035. <u>AUTOMATED TRAFFIC CONTROL SYSTEM PROHIBITED</u>
- 8 [LIMITATION ON MUNICIPALITIES].
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 542.2035(a), Transportation Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) Notwithstanding any other law, this state, a local
- 12 <u>authority</u>, a school district, a governmental agency that provides
- 13 <u>services to a school district, or an intermediate education agency</u>
- 14 [A municipality] may not implement or operate an automated traffic
- 15 control system with respect to a highway or street under its
- 16 jurisdiction for the purpose of enforcing compliance with posted
- 17 speed limits. The attorney general shall enforce this subsection.
- SECTION 3. (a) Notwithstanding the changes in law made by
- 19 this Act to Section 542.2035, Transportation Code, if before June
- 20 1, 2017, this state, a local authority, a school district, a
- 21 governmental agency that provides services to a school district, or
- 22 an intermediate education agency had enacted an order, ordinance,
- 23 or rule to implement an automated traffic control system and
- 24 entered into a contract for the administration and enforcement of

- 1 the system, the entity may continue to operate the system under that
- 2 order, ordinance, or rule and under the terms of that contract until
- 3 the expiration date specified in the contract as the contract
- 4 existed on June 1, 2017.
- 5 (b) Subsection (a) of this section does not apply to a
- 6 contract for the administration and enforcement of an automated
- 7 traffic control system before June 1, 2017, that explicitly
- 8 authorizes termination of the contract on the basis of adverse
- 9 state legislation.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
