4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:									
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,									
6	is amended by adding Section 545.3531 to read as follows:									
7	Sec. 545.3531. AUTHORITY OF DISTRICT ENGINEERS TO									
8	TEMPORARILY LOWER SPEED LIMITS. (a) In this section, "hazard"									
9	means:									
10	(1) wet or inclement weather, as defined by Section									
11	<u>545.353;</u>									
12	(2) construction or maintenance activity; or									
13	(3) any other hazardous condition.									
14	(b) A district engineer may temporarily lower a prima facie									
15	speed limit for a highway or part of a highway in a district if the									
16	district engineer determines that the prima facie speed limit for									
17	the highway or part of highway is unreasonable or unsafe because of									
18	<u>a hazard.</u>									
19	(c) A district engineer may temporarily lower a prima facie									
20	speed limit under this section without the approval of or									
21	permission from the Texas Transportation Commission.									
22	(d) A temporary speed limit established under this section:									
23	(1) is a prima facie prudent and reasonable speed									
24	limit enforceable in the same manner as other prima facie speed									

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limits established under other provisions of this subchapter; and 1 2 (2) supersedes any other established speed limit that 3 would permit a person to operate a motor vehicle at a higher rate of 4 speed. 5 (e) A district engineer who temporarily lowers a speed limit 6 shall: 7 (1) place and maintain at the hazard site temporary speed limit signs that conform to the manual and specifications 8 9 adopted under Section 544.001; 10 (2) temporarily conceal all other signs on the highway 11 or part of a highway affected by the hazard that give notice of a speed limit that would permit a person to operate a motor vehicle at 12 13 a higher rate of speed; and (3) remove all temporary speed limit signs placed 14 under Subdivision (1) and concealments of other signs placed under 15 Subdivision (2) when: 16 17 (A) the district engineer finds that there is no longer a hazard and all equipment is removed from the hazard site; 18 19 or 20 (B) the temporary speed limit expires under 21 Subsection (g). 22 (f) A temporary speed limit established under this section is effective when the district engineer, as required under 23 Subsection (e), places temporary speed limit signs and conceals 24 other signs that would permit a person to operate a motor vehicle at 25 26 a higher rate of speed. 27 (g) A temporary speed limit established under this section
