## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority of a district engineer for the Texas
3	Department of Transportation to temporarily lower speed limits.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 545, Transportation Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 545.3531 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 545.3531. AUTHORITY OF DISTRICT ENGINEERS TO
8	TEMPORARILY LOWER SPEED LIMITS. (a) In this section, "hazard"
9	means:
10	(1) wet or inclement weather, as defined by Section
11	<u>545.353;</u>
12	(2) construction or maintenance activity; or
13	(3) any other hazardous condition.
14	(b) A district engineer may temporarily lower a prima facie
15	speed limit for a highway or part of a highway in a district if the
16	district engineer determines that the prima facie speed limit for
17	the highway or part of highway is unreasonable or unsafe because of
18	a hazard.
19	(c) A district engineer may temporarily lower a prima facie
20	speed limit under this section without the approval of or
21	permission from the Texas Transportation Commission.
22	(d) A temporary speed limit established under this section:
23	(1) is a prima facie prudent and reasonable speed
24	limit enforceable in the same manner as other prima facie speed

- 1 limits established under other provisions of this subchapter; and
- 2 (2) supersedes any other established speed limit that
- 3 would permit a person to operate a motor vehicle at a higher rate of
- 4 speed.
- 5 (e) A district engineer who temporarily lowers a speed limit
- 6 shall:
- 7 (1) place and maintain at the hazard site temporary
- 8 speed limit signs that conform to the manual and specifications
- 9 adopted under Section 544.001;
- 10 (2) temporarily conceal all other signs on the highway
- 11 or part of a highway affected by the hazard that give notice of a
- 12 speed limit that would permit a person to operate a motor vehicle at
- 13 a higher rate of speed; and
- 14 (3) remove all temporary speed limit signs placed
- 15 under Subdivision (1) and concealments of other signs placed under
- 16 Subdivision (2) when:
- 17 (A) the district engineer finds that there is no
- 18 longer a hazard and all equipment is removed from the hazard site;
- 19 or
- 20 (B) the temporary speed limit expires under
- 21 Subsection (g).
- 22 (f) A temporary speed limit established under this section
- 23 is effective when the district engineer, as required under
- 24 Subsection (e), places temporary speed limit signs and conceals
- 25 other signs that would permit a person to operate a motor vehicle at
- 26 a higher rate of speed.
- 27 (g) A temporary speed limit established under this section

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- 1 <u>is effective until the earlier of:</u>
- 2 <u>(1) the 30th day after the date the limit becomes</u>
- 3 <u>effective; or</u>
- 4 (2) the next meeting of the Texas Transportation
- 5 <u>Commission</u>.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
