A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to authorization by the Texas Higher Education
- 3 Coordinating Board for certain public junior colleges to offer
- 4 baccalaureate degree programs.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 130.0012, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Subsections (b-4), (e-1), and (g-1) and amending Subsections
- 8 (e) and (h) to read as follows:
- 9 <u>(b-4) The coordinating board may authorize baccalaureate</u>
- 10 degree programs under this section at one or more public junior
- 11 colleges that offer a degree program in the field of nursing and
- 12 <u>have demonstrated a workforce need.</u> Offering a baccalaureate
- 13 degree program under this subsection does not otherwise alter the
- 14 role and mission of a public junior college.
- 15 (e) In determining whether a public junior college may offer
- 16 [what] baccalaureate degree programs and what degree programs may
- 17 [are to] be offered, the coordinating board shall:
- 18 (1) apply the same criteria and standards the
- 19 coordinating board uses to approve baccalaureate degree programs at
- 20 general academic teaching institutions; and
- 21 (2) consider the following factors:
- 22 $\underline{\text{(A)}}$ [\frac{(1)}{1}] the workforce need for the degree
- 23 programs in the region served by the junior college;
- (B) $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ how those degree programs would

- 1 complement the other programs and course offerings of the junior
- 2 college and whether the associate degree program offered by the
- 3 junior college in the same field has been successful;
- 4 (C) [(3)] whether those degree programs would
- 5 unnecessarily duplicate the degree programs offered by other
- 6 institutions of higher education; and
- 7 $\underline{\text{(D)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(4)}}{\text{)}}$] the ability of the junior college to
- 8 support the degree programs with student enrollment [program] and
- 9 the adequacy of the junior college's facilities, faculty,
- 10 administration, libraries, and other resources.
- 11 <u>(e-1)</u> A public junior college may offer a baccalaureate
- 12 <u>degree program under this section only if its junior college</u>
- 13 <u>district meets the taxable property valuation amount established in</u>
- 14 Section 130.032.
- 15 (g-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (g), a degree program
- 16 created under Subsection (b-4) may be funded only by a public junior
- 17 college's proportionate share of state appropriations under
- 18 Section 130.003, local funds, and private sources. This subsection
- 19 does not require the legislature to appropriate state funds to
- 20 support a degree program created under Subsection (b-4).
- 21 (h) Each <u>biennium</u>, <u>each</u> public junior college offering a
- 22 baccalaureate degree program under this section shall conduct a
- 23 review of each baccalaureate degree program offered and prepare a
- 24 [biennial] report on the operation, quality, and effectiveness of
- 25 <u>those</u> [the junior college's baccalaureate] degree programs. A [and
- 26 shall deliver a copy of the report shall be delivered to the
- 27 coordinating board in the form and at the time determined by the

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- 1 coordinating board.
- 2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
