A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to policies and training regarding the use of epinephrine
- 3 auto-injectors by public institutions of higher education;
- 4 providing immunity.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 38.202, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (e) to read
- 8 as follows:
- 9 (a) The commissioner of state health services shall
- 10 establish an advisory committee to examine and review the
- 11 administration of epinephrine auto-injectors to a person
- 12 experiencing an anaphylactic reaction on a campus of a school
- 13 district, [ex] an open-enrollment charter school, or an institution
- 14 of higher education.
- 15 (b) The advisory committee shall be composed of members
- 16 appointed by the commissioner of state health services. In making
- 17 appointments, the commissioner shall ensure that:
- 18 (1) a majority of the members are physicians with
- 19 expertise in treating anaphylaxis, including physicians who
- 20 specialize in the fields of pediatrics, allergies, asthma, and
- 21 immunology; [and]
- 22 (2) at least one member is a registered nurse employed
- 23 by a school district or open-enrollment charter school as a school
- 24 nurse;

- 1 (3) at least one member is an employee of a general
- 2 <u>academic teaching institution; and</u>
- 3 (4) at least one member is an employee of a public
- 4 junior college or a public technical institute.
- 5 (e) In this section, "general academic teaching
- 6 institution," "institution of higher education," "public junior
- 7 <u>college," and "public technical institute" have the meanings</u>
- 8 assigned by Section 61.003.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 38.207, Education Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 38.207. ADVISORY COMMITTEE: DUTIES. The advisory
- 12 committee shall advise the commissioner of state health services
- 13 on:
- 14 (1) the storage and maintenance of epinephrine
- 15 auto-injectors on school campuses and campuses of institutions of
- 16 <u>higher education</u>;
- 17 (2) the training of school personnel and school
- 18 volunteers, and of personnel and volunteers at institutions of
- 19 higher education, in the administration of an epinephrine
- 20 auto-injector; and
- 21 (3) a plan for:
- 22 <u>(A)</u> one or more school personnel members or
- 23 school volunteers trained in the administration of an epinephrine
- 24 auto-injector to be on each school campus; and
- 25 (B) one or more personnel members or volunteers
- 26 of an institution of higher education trained in the administration
- 27 of an epinephrine auto-injector to be on each campus of an

- 1 institution of higher education.
- 2 SECTION 3. Chapter 51, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 3 Subchapter Y-1 to read as follows:
- 4 SUBCHAPTER Y-1. MAINTENANCE, STORAGE, ADMINISTRATION, AND
- 5 DISPOSAL OF EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTORS
- 6 Sec. 51.881. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 7 (1) "Advisory committee" means the committee
- 8 <u>established under Section 38.202.</u>
- 9 <u>(2) "Anaphylaxis" means a sudden, severe, and</u>
- 10 potentially life-threatening allergic reaction that occurs when a
- 11 person is exposed to an allergen.
- 12 (3) "Campus" means an educational unit under the
- 13 management and control of an institution of higher education and
- 14 may include, in addition to the main campus, off-campus and
- 15 secondary locations, such as branch campuses, teaching locations,
- 16 and regional centers.
- 17 (4) "Epinephrine auto-injector" means a disposable
- 18 medical drug delivery device that contains a premeasured single
- 19 dose of epinephrine that is intended to be used to treat
- 20 anaphylaxis.
- 21 (5) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
- 22 assigned by Section 61.003.
- 23 (6) "Personnel" means employees of an institution of
- 24 <u>higher education.</u>
- 25 (7) "Physician" means a person who holds a license to
- 26 practice medicine in this state.
- Sec. 51.882. MAINTENANCE, STORAGE, ADMINISTRATION, AND

- 1 DISPOSAL OF EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTORS. (a) Each institution of
- 2 higher education may adopt and implement a policy regarding the
- 3 maintenance, storage, administration, and disposal of epinephrine
- 4 auto-injectors on the institution's campus.
- 5 (b) If a policy is adopted under Subsection (a), the policy:
- 6 (1) must provide that personnel or volunteers who are
- 7 authorized and trained may administer an epinephrine auto-injector
- 8 to a person who is reasonably believed to be experiencing
- 9 anaphylaxis on the institution's campus; and
- 10 (2) may provide that personnel or volunteers who are
- 11 <u>authorized</u> and trained may administer an epinephrine auto-injector
- 12 to a person who is reasonably believed to be experiencing
- 13 anaphylaxis at an off-campus event or while in transit to or from an
- 14 off-campus event sponsored by the institution of higher education.
- 15 (c) The commissioner of state health services with advice
- 16 from the advisory committee shall adopt rules regarding the
- 17 maintenance, storage, administration, and disposal of an
- 18 epinephrine auto-injector on the campus of an institution of higher
- 19 education subject to a policy adopted under Subsection (a). The
- 20 rules must establish:
- 21 (1) the number of epinephrine auto-injectors
- 22 available at each campus;
- 23 (2) the process for each institution of higher
- 24 education to check the inventory of epinephrine auto-injectors at
- 25 regular intervals for expiration and replacement; and
- 26 (3) the amount of training required for personnel or
- 27 volunteers to administer an epinephrine auto-injector.

- 1 (d) Each institution of higher education that adopts a
- 2 policy under Subsection (a) must require that the institution's
- 3 campuses have personnel or volunteers authorized and trained to
- 4 administer an epinephrine auto-injector present.
- 5 (e) The supply of epinephrine auto-injectors at a campus
- 6 must be stored in a secure location and be easily accessible to
- 7 personnel or volunteers authorized and trained to administer an
- 8 epinephrine auto-injector.
- 9 Sec. 51.883. REPORT ON ADMINISTERING EPINEPHRINE
- 10 AUTO-INJECTOR. (a) Not later than the 10th business day after the
- 11 date a personnel member or volunteer administers an epinephrine
- 12 <u>auto-injector</u> in accordance with a policy adopted under Section
- 13 51.882(a), the institution of higher education shall report the
- 14 information required under Subsection (b) to:
- 15 (1) the physician who prescribed the epinephrine
- 16 <u>auto-injector</u>; and
- 17 (2) the commissioner of state health services.
- 18 (b) The report required under this section must include the
- 19 following information:
- 20 (1) the age of the person who received the
- 21 administration of the epinephrine auto-injector;
- 22 (2) whether the person who received the administration
- 23 of the epinephrine auto-injector was a student, a personnel member,
- 24 or a visitor;
- 25 (3) the physical location where the epinephrine
- 26 auto-injector was administered;
- 27 (4) the number of doses of epinephrine auto-injector

1 administered; (5) the title of the person who administered the 2 3 epinephrine auto-injector; and 4 (6) any other information required by the commissioner of state health services. 5 6 Sec. 51.884. TRAINING. (a) Each institution of higher 7 education that adopts a policy under Section 51.882(a) is responsible for training personnel or volunteers in the 8 9 administration of an epinephrine auto-injector. 10 (b) Training required under this section must: 11 (1) include information on: 12 (A) recognizing the signs and symptoms of 13 anaphylaxis; 14 (B) administering an epinephrine auto-injector; (C) implementing emergency procedures, if 15 16 necessary, after administering an epinephrine auto-injector; and 17 (D) properly disposing of used or expired 18 epinephrine auto-injectors; and (2) be provided in a formal training session or 19 20 through online education and be completed annually. (c) Each institution of higher education that adopts a 21 policy under Section 51.882(a) shall maintain records on the 22 23 training required under this section. Sec. 51.885. PRESCRIPTION OF EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTORS. 24 25 (a) A physician may prescribe epinephrine auto-injectors in the name of an institution of higher education that adopts a policy 26

under Section 51.882(a). The physician shall provide the

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- 1 institution with a standing order for the administration of an
- 2 epinephrine auto-injector to a person reasonably believed to be
- 3 experiencing anaphylaxis.
- 4 (b) The standing order under Subsection (a) is not required
- 5 to be patient-specific, and the epinephrine auto-injector may be
- 6 administered to a person without an established physician-patient
- 7 relationship.
- 8 (c) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law,
- 9 supervision or delegation by a physician is considered adequate if
- 10 the physician:
- 11 (1) periodically reviews the order; and
- 12 (2) is available through direct telecommunication as
- 13 needed for consultation, assistance, and direction.
- 14 (d) An order issued under this section must contain:
- 15 (1) the name and signature of the prescribing
- 16 physician;
- 17 (2) the name of the institution of higher education to
- 18 which the order is issued;
- 19 (3) the quantity of epinephrine auto-injectors to be
- 20 obtained and maintained under the order; and
- 21 (4) the date of issue.
- (e) A pharmacist may dispense an epinephrine auto-injector
- 23 to an institution of higher education without requiring the name or
- 24 any other identifying information relating to the user.
- Sec. 51.886. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. An institution
- 26 of higher education may accept gifts, grants, donations, and
- 27 federal funds to implement this subchapter.

1 Sec. 51.887. RULES. Except as otherwise provided by this subchapter, the commissioner of state health services shall adopt 2 3 rules necessary to implement this subchapter. Sec. 51.888. IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY. (a) A person who in 4 good faith takes, or fails to take, any action under this subchapter 5 is immune from civil or criminal liability or disciplinary action 6 7 resulting from that act or failure to act, including: (1) issuing an order for epinephrine auto-injectors; 8 9 (2) supervising or <u>delegating</u> the <u>administration</u> of an epinephrine auto-injector; 10 11 (3) possessing an epinephrine auto-injector; 12 (4) maintaining an epinephrine auto-injector; 13 (5) storing an epinephrine auto-injector; (6) disposing of an epinephrine auto-injector; 14 15 (7) prescribing an epinephrine auto-injector; 16 (8) dispensing an epinephrine auto-injector; 17 (9) administering, or assisting in administering, an 18 epinephrine auto-injector; (10) providing, or assisting in providing, training, 19 consultation, or advice in the development, adoption, or 20 implementation of policies, guidelines, rules, or plans; or 21 22 (11) undertaking any other act permitted or required under this subchapter. 23 24 The immunity provided by Subsection (a) is in addition (b) 25 to other immunity or limitations of liability provided by law.

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(c) Notwithstanding any other law, this subchapter does not

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- 1 liability or create a standard of care, obligation, or duty that
- 2 provides the basis for a cause of action for an act or omission
- 3 under this subchapter.
- 4 (d) An institution of higher education or a campus of an
- 5 institution of higher education is immune from suit resulting from
- 6 an act, or failure to act, under this subchapter, including an act
- 7 or failure to act under related policies and procedures.
- 8 <u>(e) A cause of action does not arise from an act or omission</u>
- 9 <u>described by this section</u>.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2018 spring
- 11 semester.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
