A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the provision of mental health telemedicine medical
3	services.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 111.001, Occupations Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	Sec. 111.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
8	(1) "Behavioral emergency" means a situation that
9	involves an individual who is behaving in a violent or
10	self-destructive manner and in which:
11	(A) preventive, de-escalative, or verbal
12	techniques are determined to be ineffective; and
13	(B) immediate restraint or seclusion of the
14	<pre>individual is necessary to prevent:</pre>
15	(i) imminent probable death or substantial
16	bodily harm to the individual because the individual is attempting
17	to commit suicide or inflict serious bodily harm; or
18	(ii) imminent physical harm to others
19	because of the individual's actions.
20	(2) "Established medical site" means a location at
21	which a patient seeks medical care that has sufficient technology
22	and medical equipment to allow for an adequate physical evaluation

of the patient.

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(3) "Face-to-face evaluation" means an evaluation of a

- 1 patient in which the treating physician or health professional and
- 2 the patient are at the same physical location or the patient is at
- 3 an established medical site.
- 4 (4) "Group or institutional setting" includes a
- 5 residential treatment facility, halfway house, jail, juvenile
- 6 detention center, prison, nursing home, group home, rehabilitation
- 7 center, and assisted living facility.
- 8 (5) "Health professional" means:
- 9 (A) a physician;
- 10 <u>(B) an individual who is:</u>
- 11 (i) licensed or certified in this state to
- 12 perform health care services, including a licensed clinical social
- 13 worker, a licensed professional counselor, and a marriage and
- 14 family therapist; and
- 15 <u>(ii) authorized to assist a physician in</u>
- 16 providing telemedicine medical services that are delegated and
- 17 supervised by the physician; or
- (C) a licensed or certified health professional,
- 19 <u>including a licensed</u> clinical social worker, a licensed
- 20 professional counselor, and a marriage and family therapist, acting
- 21 within the scope of the license or certification who performs a
- 22 telehealth service and who does not perform a telemedicine medical
- 23 service.
- 24 (6) "In-person evaluation" means an evaluation of a
- 25 patient in which the treating physician or health professional and
- 26 the patient are at the same physical location.
- 27 (7) "Patient site presenter" means an individual at

- 1 the patient's physical location who introduces the patient to the
- 2 treating physician or health professional for examination, to whom
- 3 the treating physician or health professional may delegate tasks,
- 4 and who:
- 5 (A) is licensed or certified in this state to
- 6 perform health care services and acts only within the scope of the
- 7 <u>individual's license or certification; or</u>
- 8 (B) is credentialed to provide qualified mental
- 9 health professional community services, has demonstrated and
- 10 documented competency in the work to be performed, and:
- (i) holds a bachelor's or more advanced
- 12 degree from an accredited institution of higher education with a
- 13 minimum number of hours that is equivalent to a major in psychology,
- 14 social work, medicine, nursing, rehabilitation, counseling,
- 15 sociology, human growth and development, physician assistant
- 16 studies, gerontology, special education, educational psychology,
- 17 early childhood education, or early childhood intervention;
- 18 (ii) is a registered nurse; or
- 19 (iii) completes an alternative
- 20 credentialing process identified by the Department of State Health
- 21 <u>Services.</u>
- 22 (8) "Physician" has ["Health professional" and
- 23 "physician" have] the meaning [meanings] assigned by Section
- 24 1455.001, Insurance Code.
- 25 [(2) "Telehealth service" and "telemedicine medical
- 26 service" have the meanings assigned by Section 57.042, Utilities
- 27 Code.]

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 111.004, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 111.004. RULES. The Texas [State Board of] Medical
- 4 Board [Examiners], in consultation with the commissioner of
- 5 insurance, as appropriate, may adopt rules necessary to:
- 6 (1) ensure that patients using telemedicine medical
- 7 services receive appropriate, quality care;
- 8 (2) prevent abuse and fraud in the use of telemedicine
- 9 medical services, including rules relating to the filing of claims
- 10 and records required to be maintained in connection with
- 11 telemedicine medical services;
- 12 (3) ensure adequate supervision of health
- 13 professionals who are not physicians and who provide telemedicine
- 14 medical services;
- 15 (4) establish the maximum number of health
- 16 professionals who are not physicians that a physician may supervise
- 17 through a telemedicine medical service; and
- 18 (5) subject to Section 111.005, require a face-to-face
- 19 consultation between a patient and a physician providing a
- 20 telemedicine medical service within a certain number of days
- 21 following an initial telemedicine medical service only if the
- 22 physician has never seen the patient.
- 23 SECTION 3. Chapter 111, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 24 adding Section 111.005 to read as follows:
- Sec. 111.005. PROVISION OF MENTAL HEALTH TELEMEDICINE
- 26 MEDICAL SERVICES. A treating physician or health professional
- 27 providing only mental health telemedicine medical services to a

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- 1 patient:
- 2 (1) is not required to engage the services of a patient
- 3 site presenter, except in a behavioral emergency;
- 4 (2) shall consider the patient's private home or a
- 5 group or institutional setting where the patient resides as an
- 6 <u>established medical site; and</u>
- 7 (3) is not required to conduct a face-to-face or
- 8 <u>in-person evaluation of the patient to diagnose the patient in the</u>
- 9 establishment of a physician-patient relationship with the
- 10 patient, except in a behavioral emergency, provided the physician
- 11 or health professional otherwise meets the standard of care.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
