## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the creation of an instructional materials web portal
- 3 by the commissioner of education.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 31, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Subchapter B-2 to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER B-2. INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS WEB PORTAL
- 8 Sec. 31.081. INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS WEB PORTAL. (a) The
- 9 commissioner shall develop and maintain a web portal to assist
- 10 school districts and open-enrollment charter schools in selecting
- 11 instructional materials under Section 31.101.
- 12 (b) The web portal must include general information such as
- 13 price, computer system requirements, and any other relevant
- 14 specifications for each instructional material:
- 15 (1) on the instructional materials list, including the
- 16 list adopted under Section 31.0231; or
- 17 (2) submitted by a publisher for inclusion in the web
- 18 portal.
- 19 <u>(c) The commissioner by rule shall establish the procedure</u>
- 20 by which a publisher may submit instructional materials for
- 21 inclusion in the web portal.
- 22 (d) The commissioner shall use a competitive process to
- 23 contract for the development of the web portal.
- Sec. 31.082. QUALITY OF INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS SUBMITTED

- 1 BY PUBLISHER. (a) The commissioner shall contract with a private
- 2 entity to conduct an independent analysis of each instructional
- 3 material submitted by a publisher for inclusion in the web portal
- 4 developed under Section 31.081. The analysis must:
- 5 (1) evaluate the quality of the material; and
- 6 (2) determine the extent to which the material covers
- 7 the essential knowledge and skills identified under Section 28.002
- 8 for the subject and grade level for which the material is intended
- 9 to be used, including an identification of:
- 10 (A) each of the essential knowledge and skills
- 11 for the subject and grade level or levels covered by the material;
- 12 and
- 13 (B) the percentage of the essential knowledge and
- 14 skills for the subject and grade level or levels covered by the
- 15 <u>material</u>.
- 16 (b) The commissioner shall include in the web portal
- 17 developed under Section 31.081 the results of each analysis
- 18 conducted under Subsection (a).
- 19 Sec. 31.083. INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS REPOSITORY. (a) In
- 20 this section, "open educational resource" means a teaching,
- 21 learning, or research resource that is in the public domain or has
- 22 been released under an intellectual property license that permits
- 23 the free use and repurposing of the resource by any person. The
- 24 term may include full course curricula, course materials, modules,
- 25 textbooks, streaming videos, tests, software, and any other tools,
- 26 materials, or techniques used to support access to knowledge.
- 27 (b) The commissioner shall include in the web portal

- 1 developed under Section 31.081 a repository of open educational
- 2 resources and other electronic instructional materials that school
- 3 districts and open-enrollment charter schools may access at no
- 4 cost, including state-developed open-source instructional
- 5 materials purchased under Subchapter B-1.
- 6 (c) A publisher may submit instructional materials for
- 7 inclusion in the repository.
- 8 Sec. 31.084. RULES. The commissioner may adopt rules as
- 9 necessary to implement this subchapter.
- SECTION 2. Section 31.004(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 (b) To determine whether each student has instructional
- 13 materials that cover all elements of the essential knowledge and
- 14 skills as required by Subsection (a), a school district or
- 15 open-enrollment charter school may consider:
- 16 (1) instructional materials adopted by the State Board
- 17 of Education;
- 18 (2) materials adopted or purchased by the commissioner
- 19 under Section 31.0231 or Subchapter B-1;
- 20 (3) open-source instructional materials submitted by
- 21 eligible institutions and adopted by the State Board of Education
- 22 under Section 31.0241;
- 23 (4) open-source instructional materials made
- 24 available by other public schools; [and]
- 25 (5) instructional materials developed or purchased by
- 26 the school district or open-enrollment charter school; and
- 27 (6) open educational resources and other electronic

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- 1 instructional materials included in the repository under Section
- 2 31.083.
- 3 SECTION 3. Not later than September 1, 2018, the
- 4 commissioner of education shall develop the web portal required
- 5 under Subchapter B-2, Chapter 31, Education Code, as added by this
- 6 Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
