- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1601.002, Occupations Code, is amended

- 8 "barbering," "practicing barbering," or the "practice of
- 9 barbering" means:
- 10 (1) performing or offering or attempting to perform
- 11 for compensation or the promise of compensation any of the
- 12 following services:
- 13 (A) treating a person's mustache or beard by
- 14 arranging, beautifying, coloring, processing, shaving, styling, or
- 15 trimming;
- 16 (B) treating a person's hair by:
- 17 (i) arranging, beautifying, bleaching,
- 18 cleansing, coloring, curling, dressing, dyeing, processing,
- 19 [shampooing,] shaping, singeing, straightening, styling, tinting,
- 20 or waving;
- 21 (ii) providing a necessary service that is
- 22 preparatory or ancillary to a service under Subparagraph (i),
- 23 including bobbing, clipping, cutting, or trimming; or
- 24 (iii) cutting the person's hair as a

- 1 separate and independent service for which a charge is directly or
- 2 indirectly made separately from a charge for any other service;
- 3 (C) cleansing, stimulating, or massaging a
- 4 person's scalp, face, neck, arms, or shoulders:
- 5 (i) by hand or by using a device, apparatus,
- 6 or appliance; and
- 7 (ii) with or without the use of any cosmetic
- 8 preparation, antiseptic, tonic, lotion, or cream;
- 9 (D) beautifying a person's face, neck, arms, or
- 10 shoulders using a cosmetic preparation, antiseptic, tonic, lotion,
- 11 powder, oil, clay, cream, or appliance;
- 12 (E) treating a person's nails by:
- (i) cutting, trimming, polishing, tinting,
- 14 coloring, cleansing, manicuring, or pedicuring; or
- 15 (ii) attaching false nails;
- 16 (F) massaging, cleansing, treating, or
- 17 beautifying a person's hands;
- 18 (G) administering facial treatments;
- (H) weaving a person's hair by using any method
- 20 to attach commercial hair to a person's hair or scalp; or
- 21 (I) [shampooing or conditioning a person's hair;

- 23 [(J)] servicing in any manner listed in Paragraph
- 24 (B) a person's wig, toupee, or artificial hairpiece on a person's
