- 1 may provide documentation as required by Subsection (b)(1) by
- 2 submitting to the local law enforcement agency an affidavit stating
- 3 that the senior citizen has an impaired mental condition. The local
- 4 <u>law enforcement agency may not require additional documentation</u>
- 5 under Subsection (b)(1) from a family or legal guardian who submits
- 6 an affidavit as described by this subsection.
